Rasmussen Peter Corner Horey  
Hendrik. Cloudy. Light S.E.  
breeze. Temp at noon  $7\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$   $45\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  F.  
<sup>book made boat on deck</sup>  
All went well till 2:35 p. + then the  
engine stopped. While Hendrik was  
working over it, K.R. + Peter hoisted  
the sails. We were off Saunders Is. Water  
very open. A half hour or so I  
work put the engine in order  
again, sails were lowered +  
we went on under power  
3 p.m. off mouth Granville Bay  
temp  $38^{\circ}$  cloudy. Considerable ice  
before Granville Bay + Booth Island  
there was much ice in very big  
+ little, pans + bits. Interesting  
to watch them thread way  
thru. Now 1/2, no full speed

+ twisting about, sometimes  
making very sudden turns  
Captain corner standing  
with ice pole

water is freezing.

9:05 Cut moved far enough from

small berg & let us go through

up against a big pan of  
rough ice 6"-12" thick which  
caused all four men ~~the~~  
hardest kind of work for  $1\frac{3}{4}$   
hr to with poles axe snow  
knives crowbar & so on to cut  
a way through so that Hen-  
drick by running & backing  
the engine could finally free  
the boat. At 10:50 we are in  
open water & the way seems  
clear for a long distance -  
I was not of much use, but  
I jumped out occasionally  
& pushed cataras of ice with  
an oar from deck as often  
as I could.  
At 9 o'clock was clear.

I sent Captain corner ashore with K. R. to get measured for a pair of Kamiks, much against Gr. Cr. is apparent wisher.

Narsak is on a plain that looks from the sea to be formed from terminal moraine of former glacier. Water in little cove is very shallow and abounds in luxuriant laminarias. The numerous boulders in the cove which protrude at low tide show theounding due to action of the yearly ice

took the barrel of flour to N.S.B.  
for us last winter on top of the

said that he did not want any  
pay now for helping us out  
of our present difficulties but  
R.R. told him & I confirmed it  
that he should be paid in mo-  
ney. Kolutinqual has the feel-  
ing that most of these Eskimos  
seem to have of freely helping  
other people in emergencies.  
He understands & uses a few  
English words.

All the men ~~and women~~ were  
away from the traps hunting  
in their Kayaks. Asayo and Ana-  
nik went over to Kiatk several  
days ago, and there is no telling  
when they will return. Hence  
K.R. had to get Ananik's sister,  
Ariangorneq, to make the Kamiks  
for Captain Coker.

Saw Ivaluh here also Mat Hudson

boy, a fine little fellow with wavy hair, and the engineer's boy who was born at the same time but is not nearly so large or clever.

Both show their foreign blood all right - no sympathy need be given to Mat's boy but the other has a wistful expression of face.

We were ready to sail by 12:30 but the fog setting in through the stair warned the men not to start but to wait for more favorable weather.


Went ashore again in afternoon and climbed up to bank of Terra forming shore front. Above this the slope of the wash plain is gradual. Pretty water fall over sandstones & shales. Called an Aviangoing's Iglo - Sawdust Sarah and her baby Ivaluk is a rather pretty young

woman, but does not show so  
much character in her face  
as do some of the other women  
met like, for example. The baby  
who is now 9 or 10 months old  
at least looks like any other Es-  
Kimo baby, though her hair is  
perhaps rather brown and fine.  
Resembles mother in looks -  
Good families here - Arrangornerq  
has five children, two other women  
from each -

Temp 4 p.  $46^{\circ}$ . Fog in the strait, N.W. wind  
rather strong.

The high wind began to moderate  
about six & fog was gone -  
Got under way for Etah. Colder  
I think 9 p.  $40^{\circ}$ .

In the western end of Her  
bert Is. a transverse dike  
rises through the whole thickness  
of sedimentaries and cuts across  
their top as a wall. Horizon-  
tally columnar. Perhaps  
a mile north of this a dike  
rises at a very low angle  
from a sill near the middle  
of the bluff to a sill  
 $200 - 250'$  higher. Thus

character.


17 Aug. 6 a.m. Again at Sarfa-  
lik, so well remembered from  
last September's trip in the high  
Lis. Calm to-day, fortunately.  
Amount of green grass on slopes  
of cliff west of Sarflik is sur-  
prising. There is enough to give  
decided color to them, ~~with~~ from  
bare well up toward top.

6:50 Engine went astray again  
but Hendrik had it fixed and  
running again at 7:35  
Calm night, cloudy & damp  
almost raining part of time  
Went close in at Nerke to  
see if Mac might be there  
No signs of him

Sa. Overcast & raining gently

light N or NW wind Temp 38°  
Off Sutherland Island. This is  
a regular hogback ridge E-W  
Yellowish & pink quartzite.

Place where we anchored night  
of 14 Sept 1911 looks in some  
strength. Glacier is very  
dirty. Sea open in every  
direction. Many bags  
Some walrus but not so many  
as last Sept



Cape Alexander from south  
But N.W. side of cape is much  
more precipitous & has very  
small amount of slopes.  
8:30 Rounded the cape

Saw several herds of walruses in bay north of camp near glacier.

Ellesmere Land coast & Pim Island very distinct though sky is leaden. No wind for first time in Rasmussen's experience. West headland rich in color - yellow + pink & black basalt orange lichens green grass. Disintegration at a standstill here now raw practically no fresh debris or fractured surfaces.

10:30 am Etah

He showed me 7 boxes containing  
fox skins and said that  
there were all that we had  
and that they averaged 25 a  
box or 175 to 200 in all, not more

This number being not too many for probable scientific needs of Mrs. K. R. ~~Clews~~ ~~especially~~ acquiesced in my plan to take all to N.Y. and let him know of surplus over needs as determined by our zoölogists. My idea is that the surplus shd be sent to K. R. as a gift, on account of all the trouble that has been made over the trading.

Mac & I went only partly into history of events at Etah during past 3 yrs. but it is evident that he will put up a strong defense against the charges made by the members of the Expedition. Says Eric is hard worker, but that F. G. wld not acknowledge Mrs. authority and did not do work assigned to + promised by him, that Lang is indolent and failed to use facilities afforded him, that Jerome is a willing worker + got also

18 Aug - 1:15 a.m. left house for  
point where loaded on 80  
gal kerosene + 5 gal lubricating  
oil for trip to Umanak +  
210 gal kerosene + 10 gal lubri-

3 cases pemmican (14 lbs) 2 cans

not finished because we were  
not expected till tomorrow.

5:25 Sailed from Ullugash.  
Still overcast and chilly &  
damp. Light northwly wind  
Temp  $37^{\circ}$  <sup>Temp  $38^{\circ}$</sup>   
arr. Narsak 8 $\frac{1}{2}$  h., where went  
ashore & visited Kolutingwak's  
topic. Has fine family of attractive  
wife (<sup>long winged or long neck</sup> Egnukshuk's sister), married  
daughter (<sup>aer adiaha</sup> Koodlootka's wife) son  $^{16}$  two  
girls of 10 & 8 and boy of 3. Mother  
and daughter are handsome  
women & latter has pretty daughter  
of 4 yrs. Left at 9:45. Pa Kamiks

made by Kolubingwak's wife; excellent.

Natives at Ullugset told us about fragment  
of ship's small boat painted green or yellow  
which they had found in the ice within a few  
days & wh. is now at Kiatek (E) - <sup>carcass</sup> of whole  
bound buried in sand near Ullugset found this sum-  
mer. Above sea level. Very old but meat still edible  
by the dogs.

19 Aug. Sat. Ran as far as Natchiluk last  
night bringing Kolubingwak with us, the  
idea being to climb the hills there and get idea  
of ice off Cape Parry. Arr. 10:35, but fog  
had set in so thick that we could go no fur-  
ther. Hence spent quiet night at anchor.

Now, 6:30 a., K. R. + Kolubingwak have gone  
ashore and up the hill, since the fog is lifting.

7:40 Under way, fog having lifted.  
Ice off Cape Parry looks bad from here  
(takes 15-20 minutes to file up)  
Left Kolubingwak, Kuklukit + fog when  
I left. Fa.  $37^{\circ}$ ; 2.30 p.m.  $40^{\circ}$ ; 4 p.m.  $37^{\circ}$

Northern side of Cape Parry, i.e. entrance to Nettrelivik Bay a dike rises from one silt to another & no further

8:37 In midst of the ice. K.R. & G.C. go ashore to look for leads. <sup>Cape Rad cliff</sup> About 1/2 hr returned we anchored. Little later ice began coming toward us & large his was covered over by little berg and moved. After lunch K.R. & Hendrick climbed cliffs & at 2:25 Hendrick returned saying way seemed practicable for some distance. He began firing engine & got at 2:30 got out in little boat & began towing. While sea is thickly filled with free ice & bergs as far as Casey Is. & Northumberland & Herbert Is. Tows picked up K.R. on other side of point & about a mile or more to point just beyond big dike where K.R. & G.C. were ashore a few hours ago. Weather calm. Nor

we proceeded, conditions improving  
27

20 Aug. From about midnight

23.8. Seismograph room is the one that has been used heretofore as the meat room - "refrigerator" the boys called it. It is at the north corner of the house and is a part of the shed running along the south west and northwest sides of the main house. Room is 7' 3" (NW-S2) by 5' 9" (SW-N2) and from about 6' high N.W. side to about 7' high on S.E. side against the house. Floor is the solidly frozen ground, composed of delta-fan gravel containing many pebbles. This was leveled off approximately then the feet for the instrument were imbedded in it and fastened securely by freezing in water being poured onto the gravel that had been disturbed during the setting of the iron cups.
