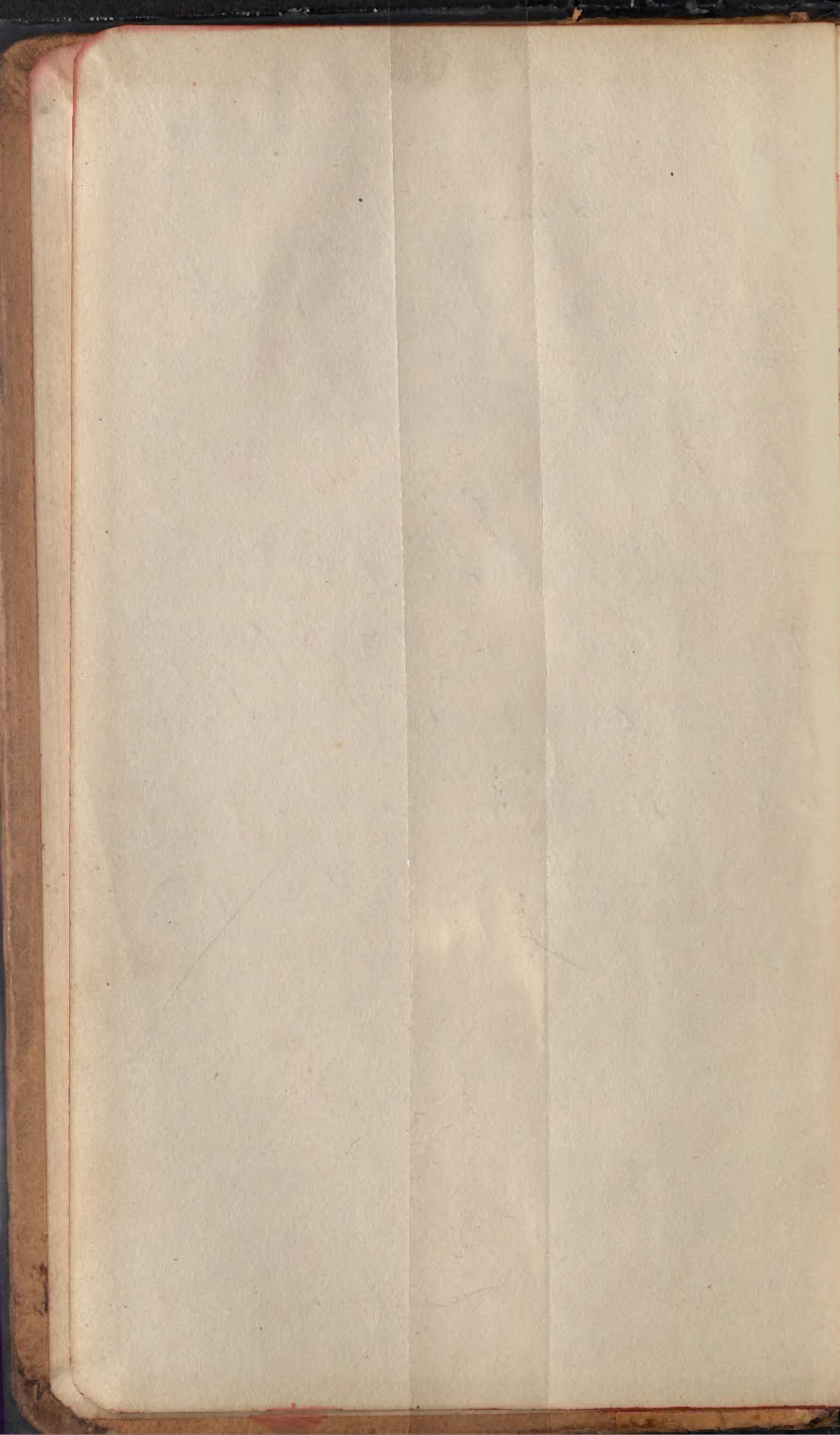

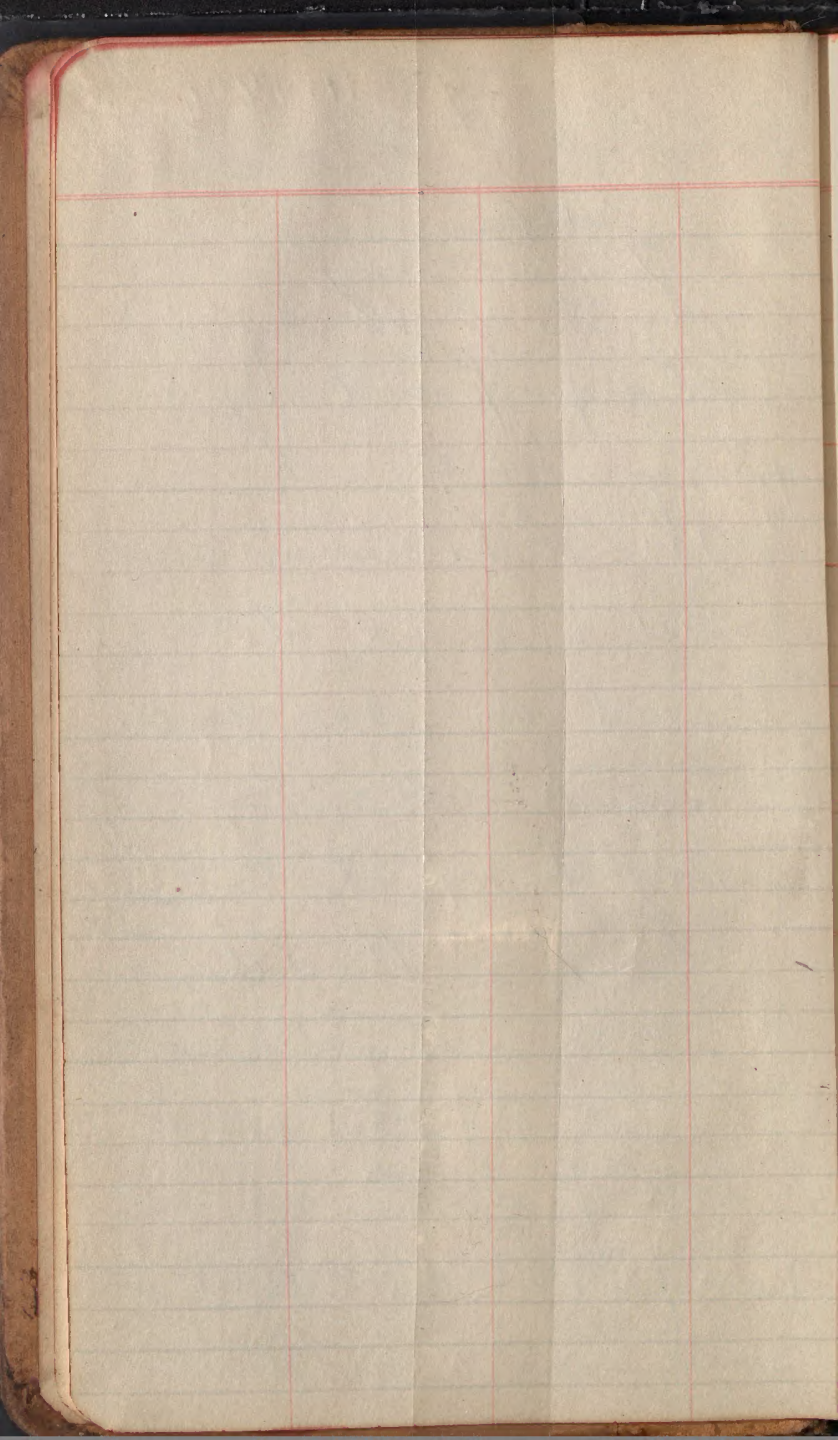
Exp. 11. 1914.

Carrion Thru

~~First~~ Day.

Every thing landed at  
head of fjord by  
motor boat.

The lake was not  
solid enough to  
travel on, so we  
tramped almost  
every thing to the  
glacier. Had dinner  
of cooked meat, two crockers,  
then cut steps til a road  
in face of glacier.  
Panipa & Acomodungro are  
with us.



Sept 12, 1914

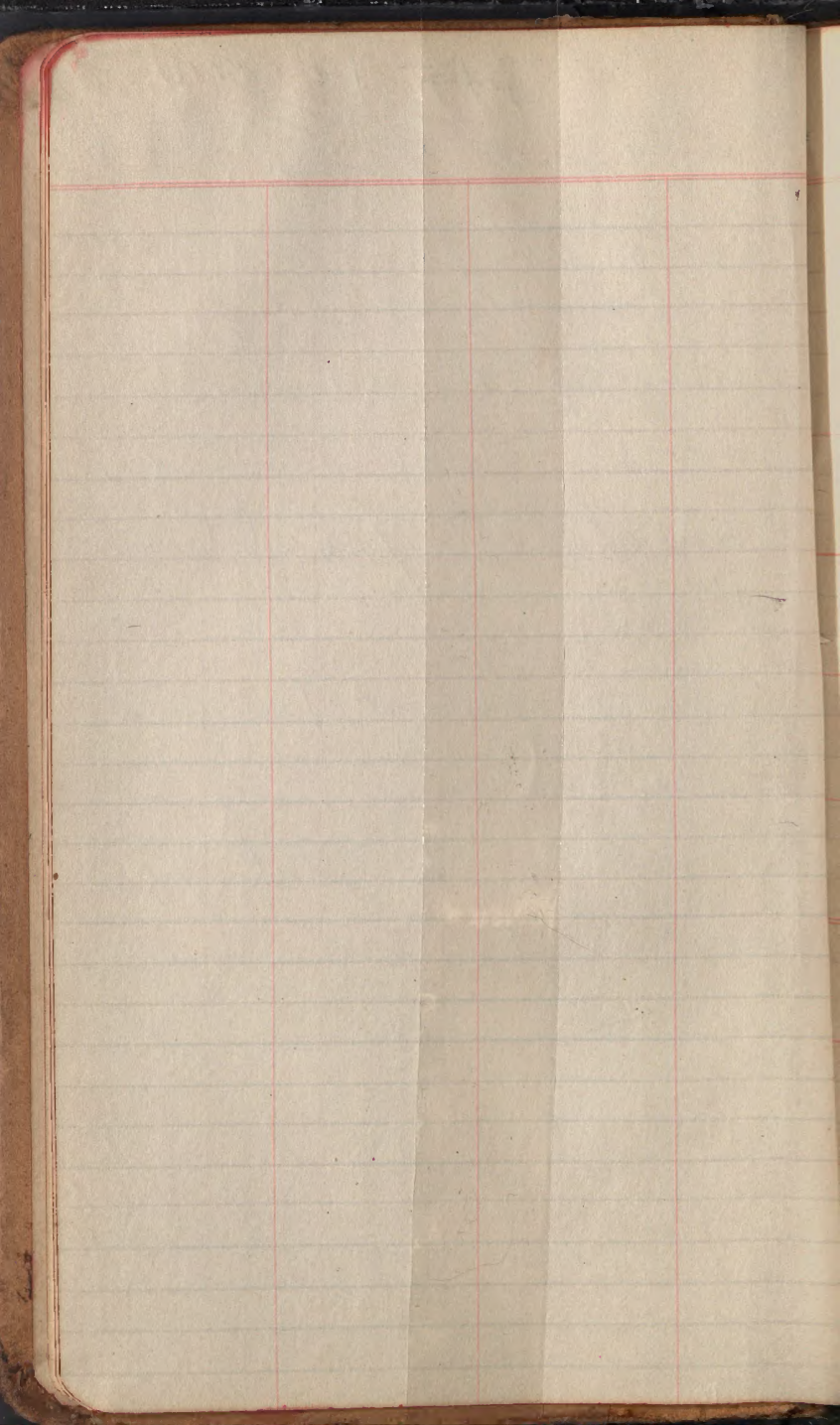
## Second Day

June's night.

Breakfast at 8.  
windy & snowing  
some, West wind,  
Panic's trees blew  
down.

Strong wind prevents  
going on ice cap and  
return to Etah for  
the night, arriving  
about 7 o'clock.

Done



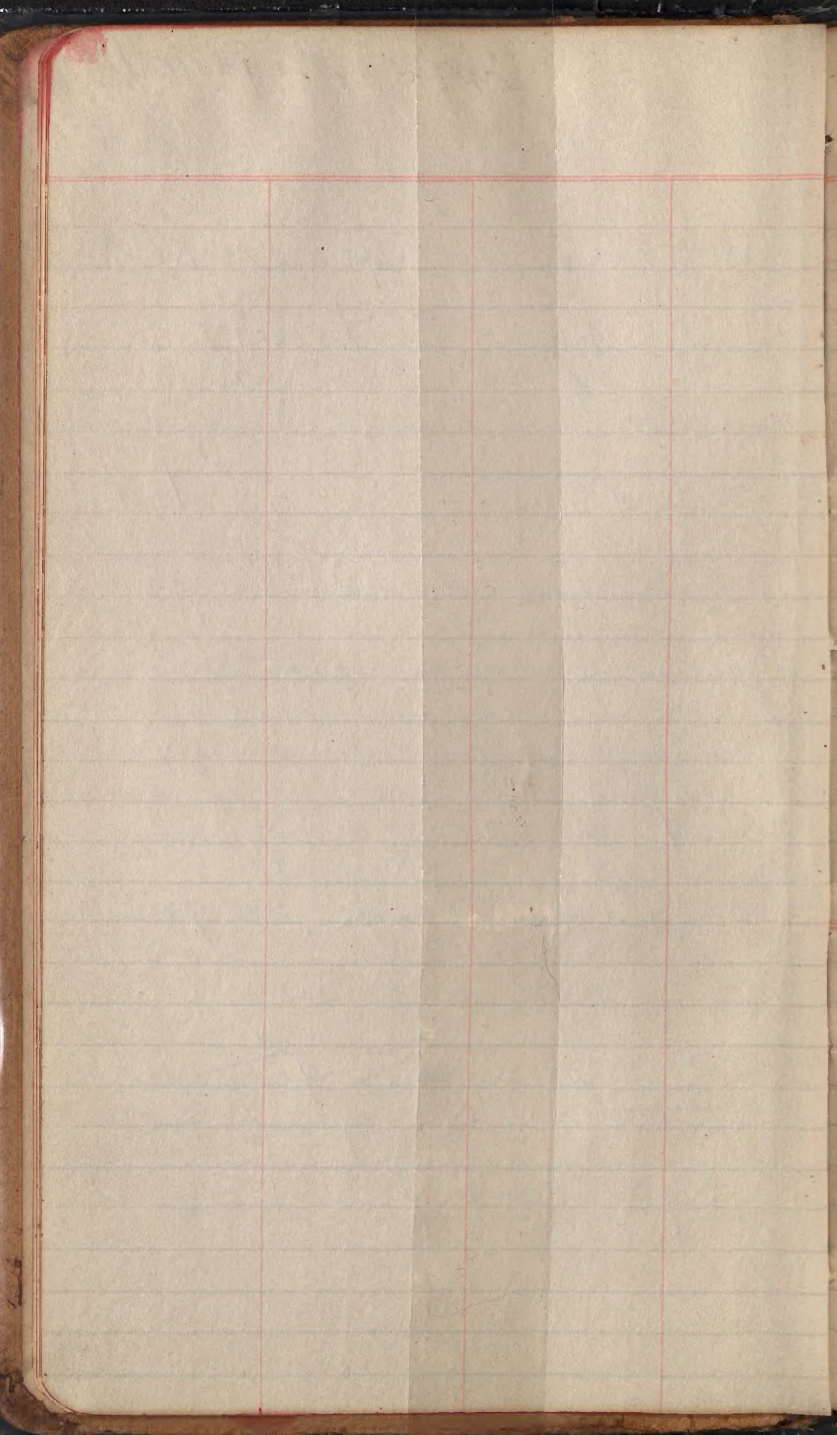
Sept 13, 1914

3 day,

Up at 4 A.M. Breakfast,  
and took to head of  
fiord, strong east wind.  
Found eskimoes in bed.

Pumped goods up  
glacier and started  
along edge of ice cap  
with good going and  
dogs on jump. Kept  
at edge all way.

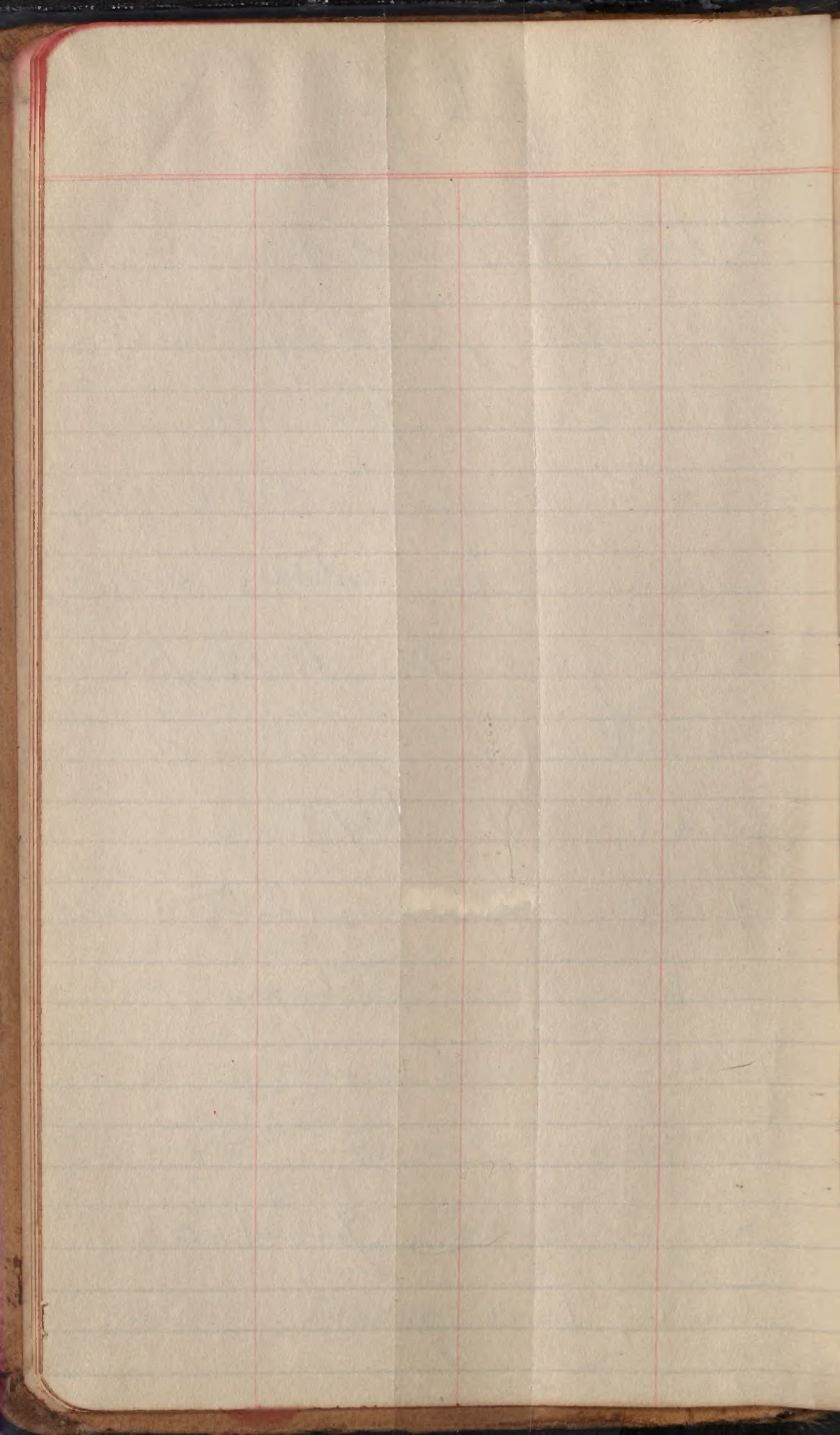
at 9 o'clock pitched  
tents had grub &  
slept til 7 in morn.



Sy 12, 1914  
4<sup>th</sup> Day,

Cook & Meneafing  
got away early, but  
were soon passed  
their dogs tied up  
where the two men  
had gone to look for  
Caribou;

we all kept on  
past them about 5 miles  
where a stream,  
now dried over,  
makes down toward  
the coast. Pitched  
tent, had grub, and  
hunted.



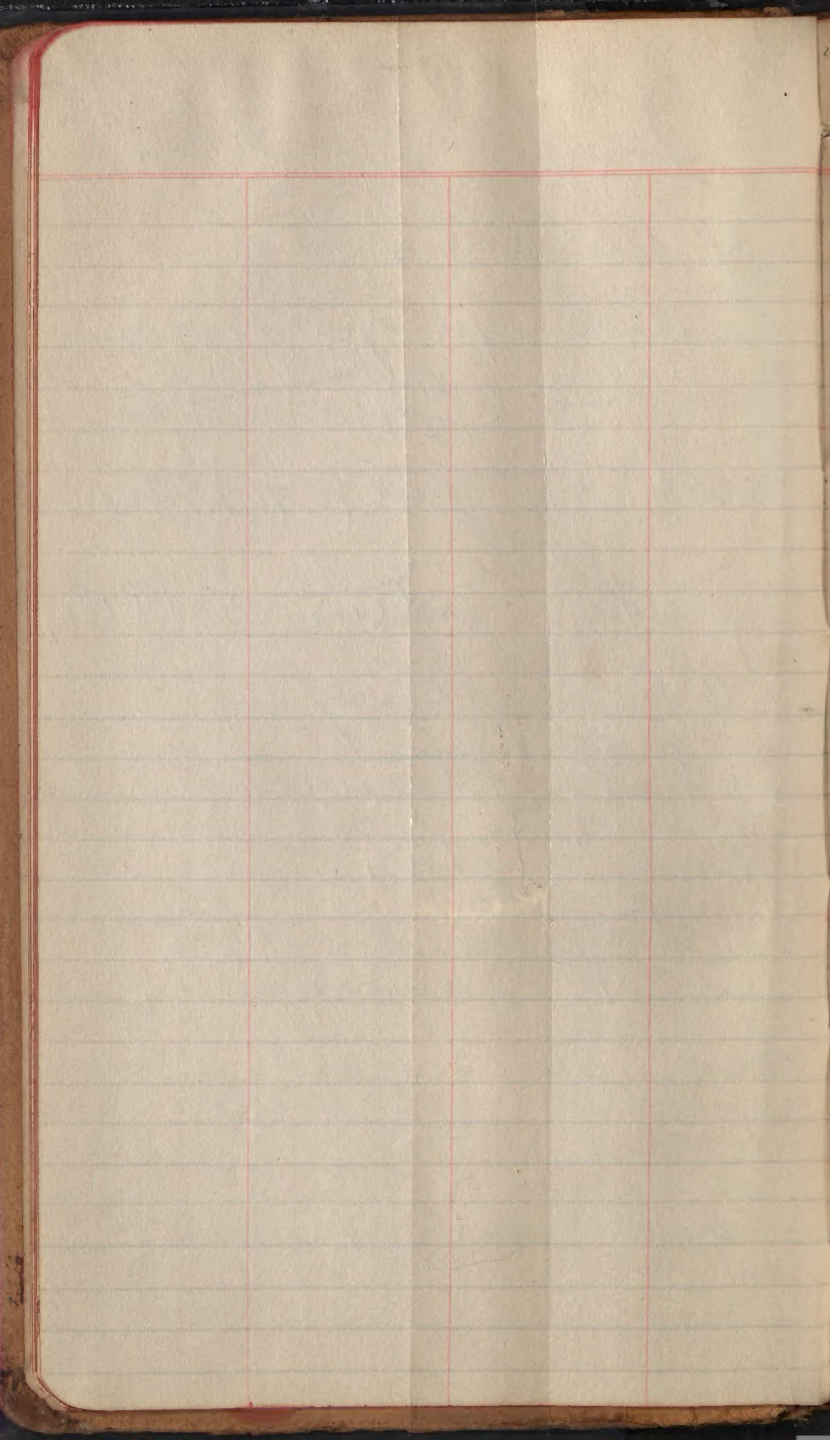
I saw no tracks  
of caribou,

New copinger saw  
some. ~~Chootashot~~  
not in yet, 7 P.M.

I shot ~~several~~ rabbits,

Accompanying us  
shot ~~stomach~~  
lost right.

It is snowing  
with no wind,  
and not cold,



July 5, 15, 1911

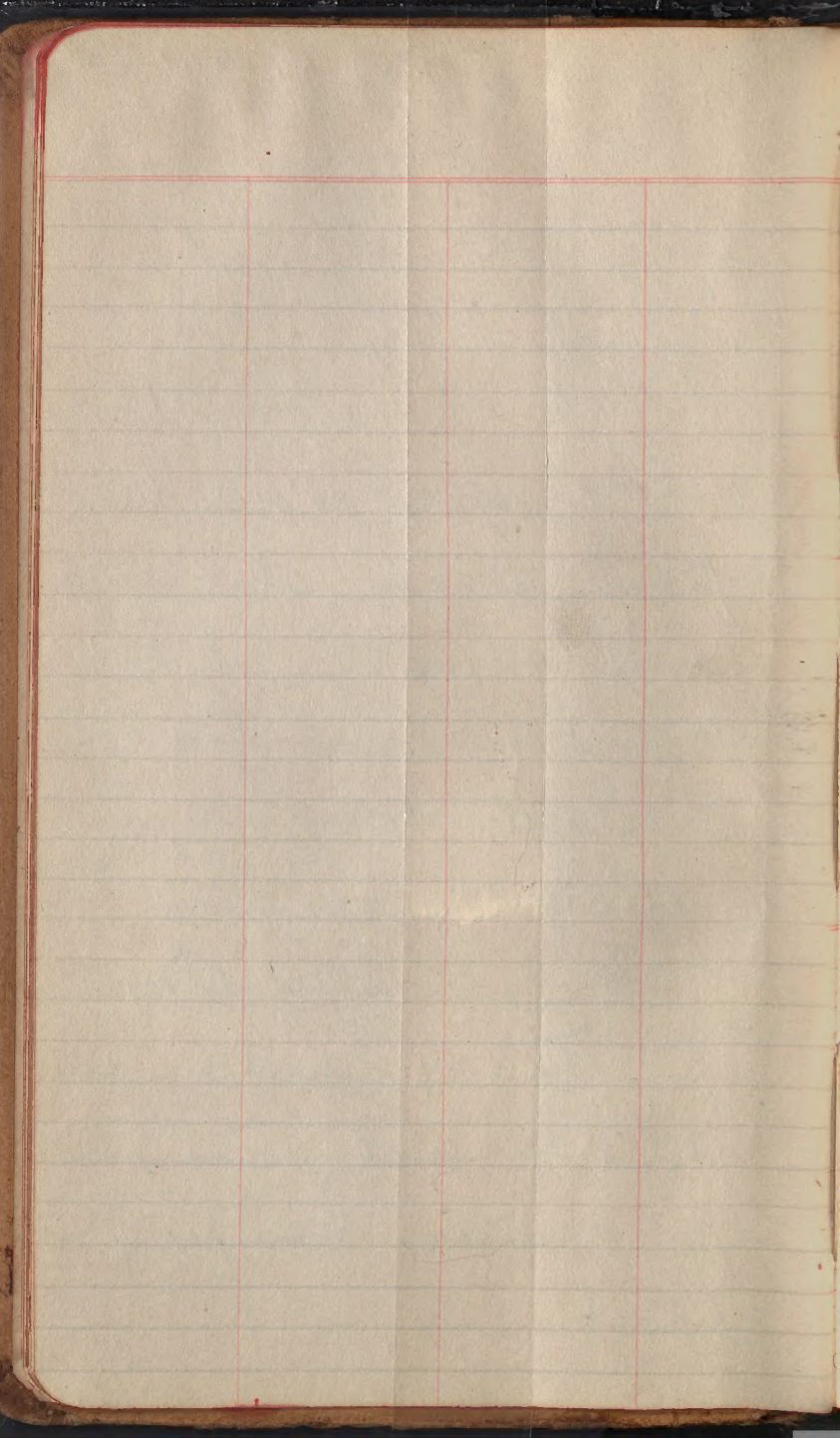
5<sup>th</sup> Day.

Snowed all night  
some.

Tracks come in about  
8 last night, saw two  
fresh tracks but were  
crossed wrong.

Breakfast in bed at  
8 o'clock in morning.  
Coffee & crackers.

Guerra will stay  
in today unless we  
start with comitiks  
for another camp  
place.

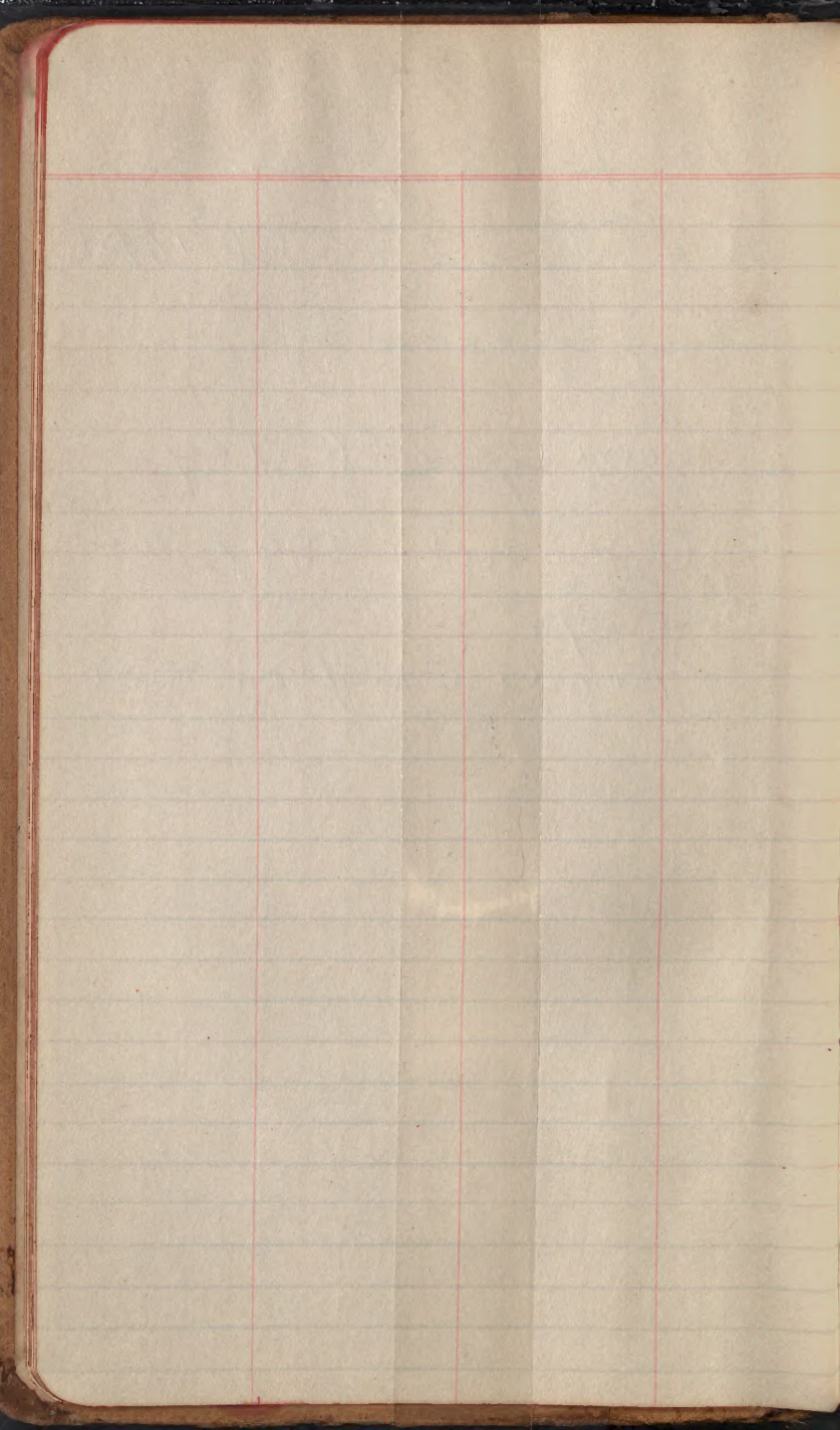


Broke camp at noon  
and traveled til 10 P.M.  
along ice edge.

Snowing all day.

Cannot see  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile  
away.

Made camp on ice.



Sept 16, 1914

6<sup>th</sup> Day,

Broke camp at 7

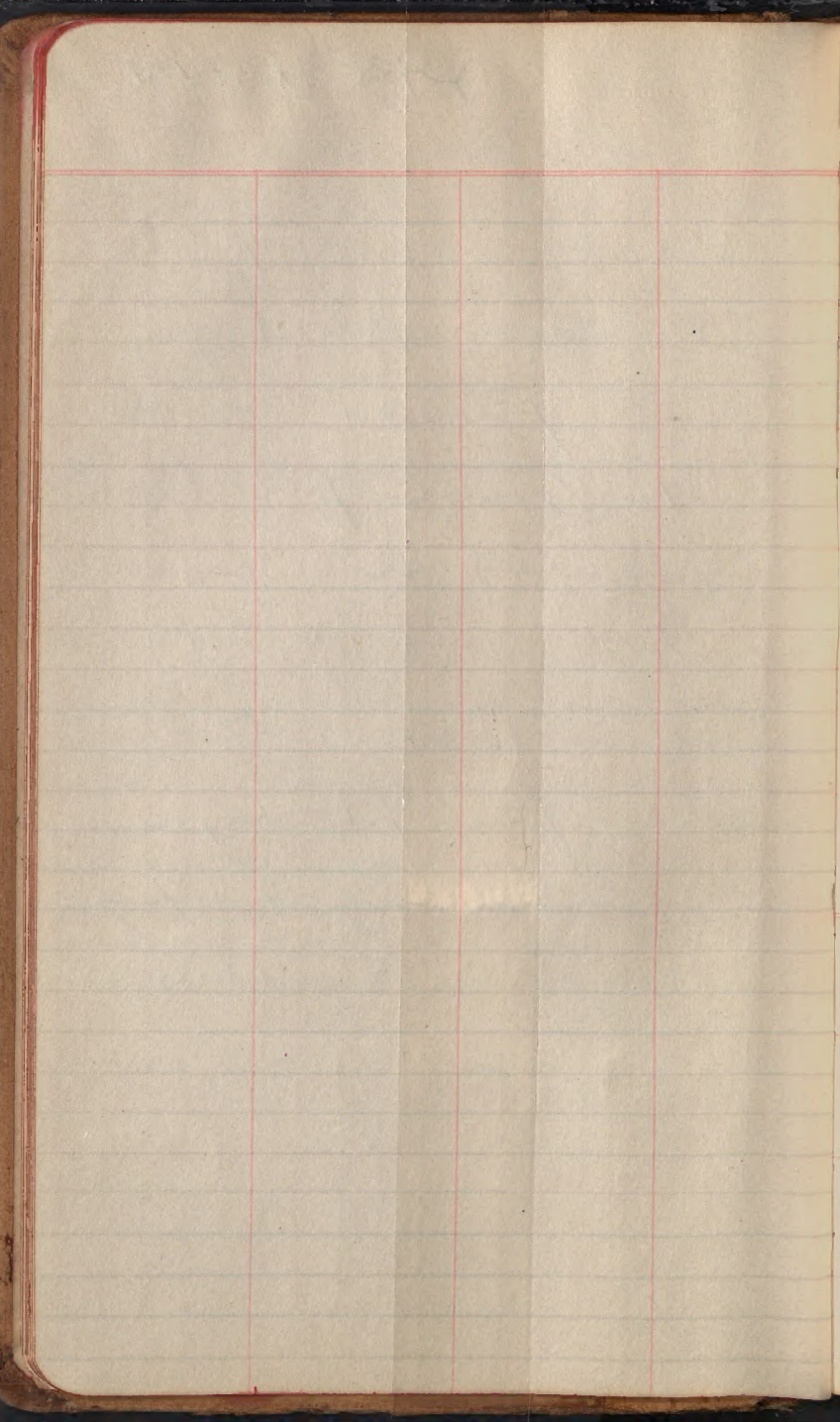
traveled all day,  
most of time on ice  
cap 1/2 mile from land.

In evening some snow wind,  
made camp at 5.30 P.M.

No caribou or tracks.

see few ptarmigan.

In evening Newcupin  
brought in 3 rabbits.



Sept. 17, 1914

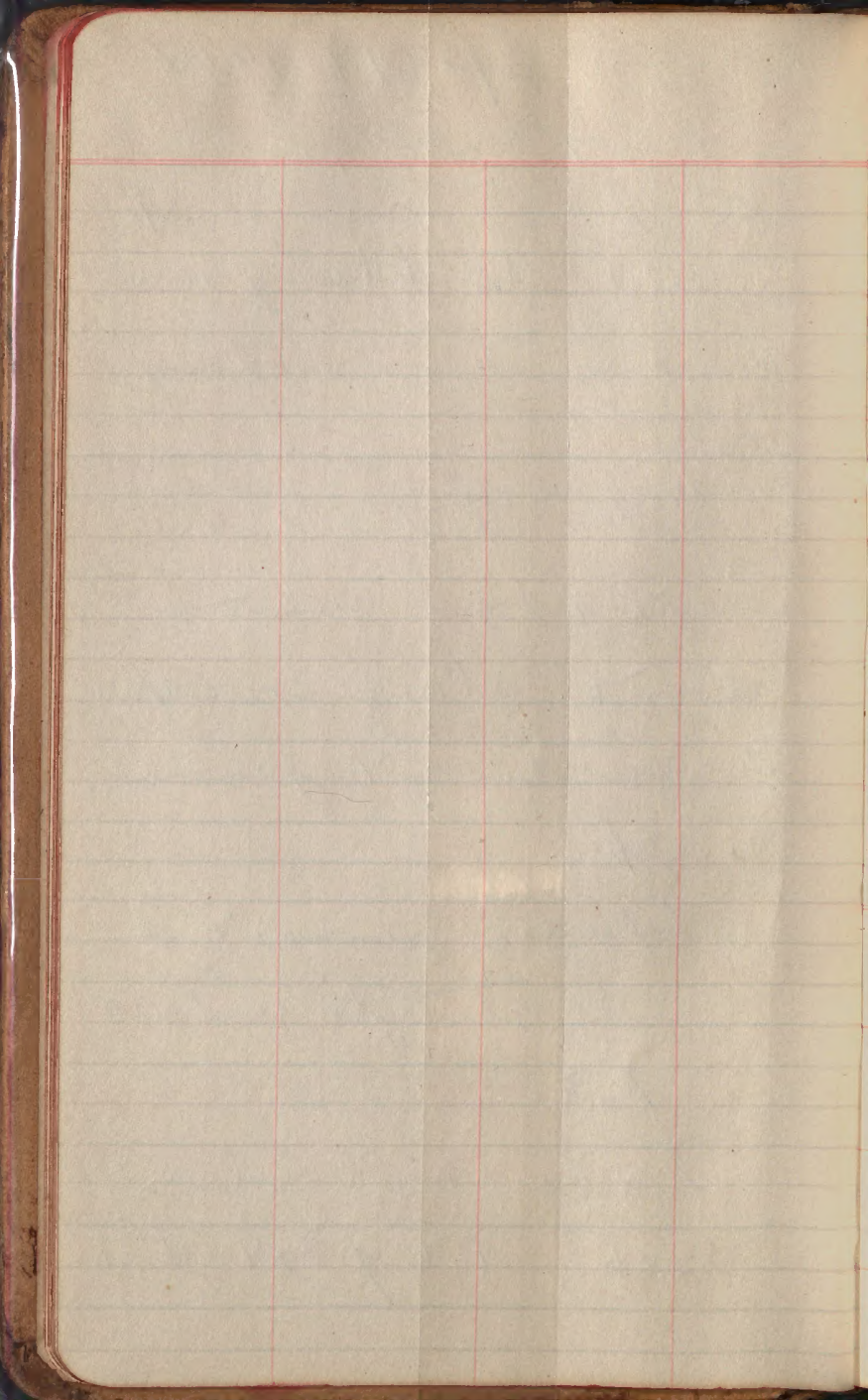
7<sup>th</sup> Day.

at 6.30, sun is up,  
wind is blowing from  
some, am making  
tea.

Late Clark & Mueca-  
mit & dogs went  
south along ice cap,  
acomading & Jimmie  
north.

Akpuai, Sammie & I  
went straight inland  
on foot.

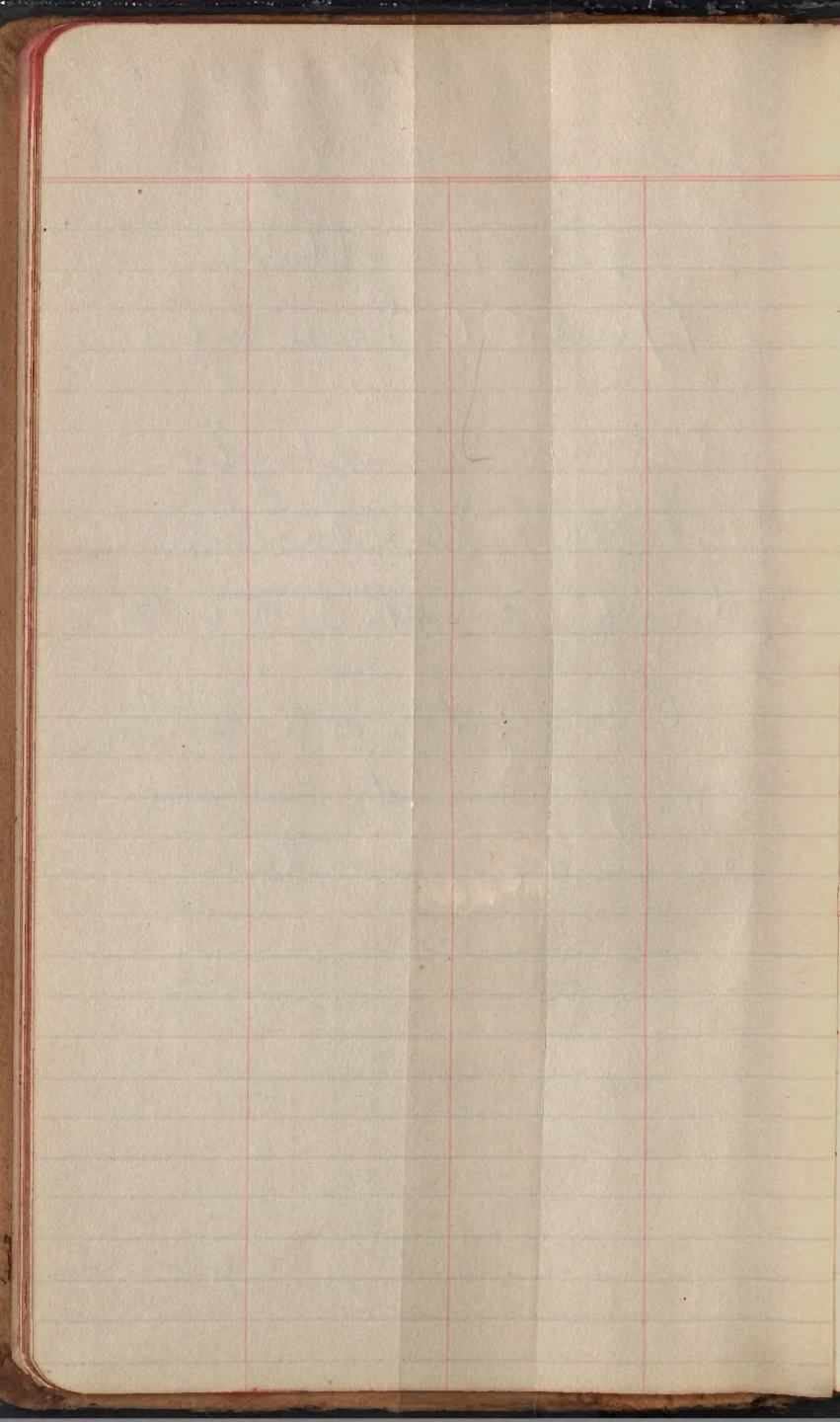
I am no caribou  
track, lots of Fox & rabbit



Acomodengue & Junt  
brazh & rabbit.  
Akjudi & Jom me 5.

About midnight  
Etork & Nenca come  
back with 3 ticta.

Cause der obh snow  
on ground, some  
wind, colder.



Sept. 18, 1914

8<sup>th</sup> Day.

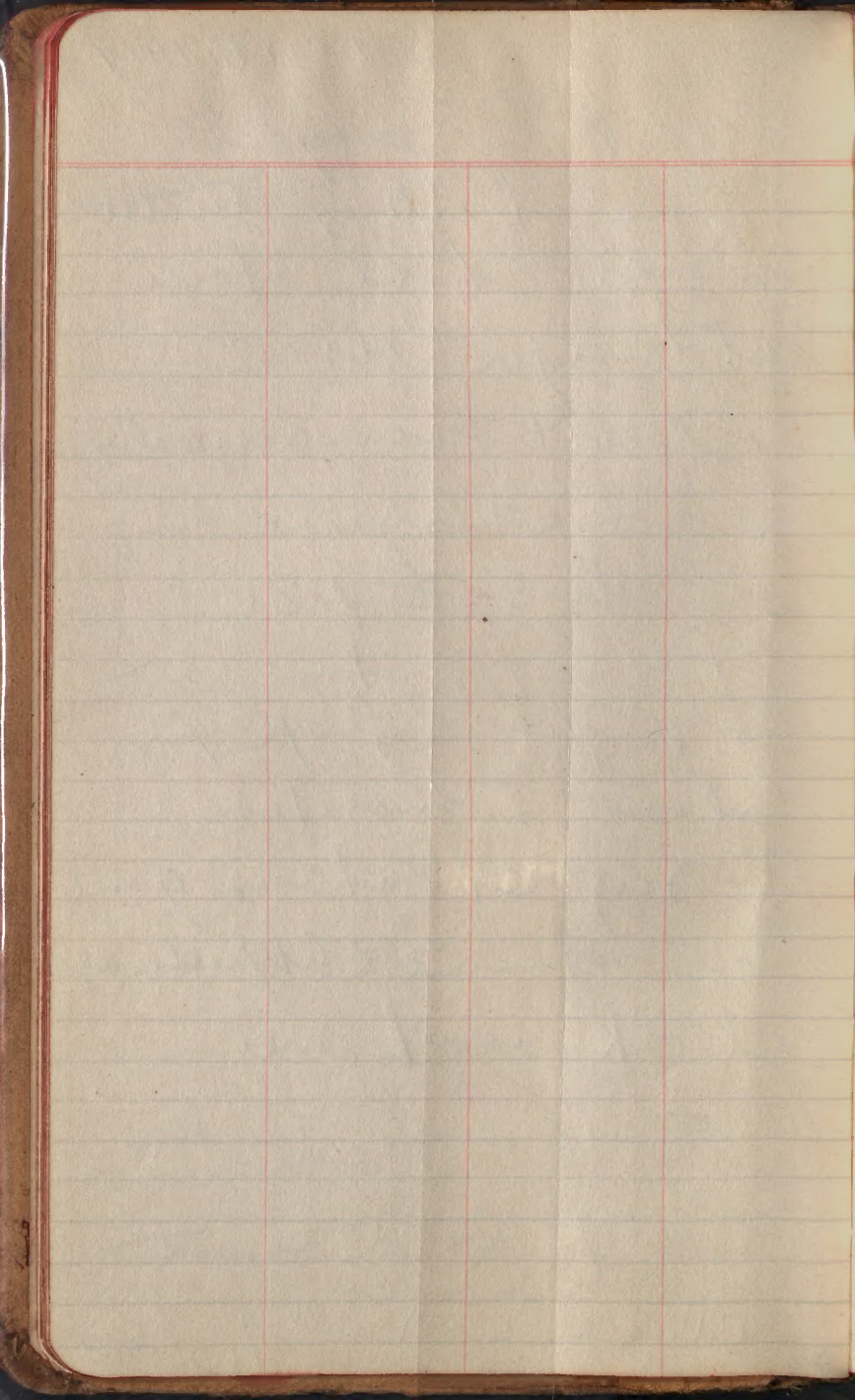
Am boiling tucuman  
meat. have three  
plumiga also.

Took a new carabap.  
acomodadora is  
in this tube.

Pometa has not  
caught us up for  
lost 2 marches.

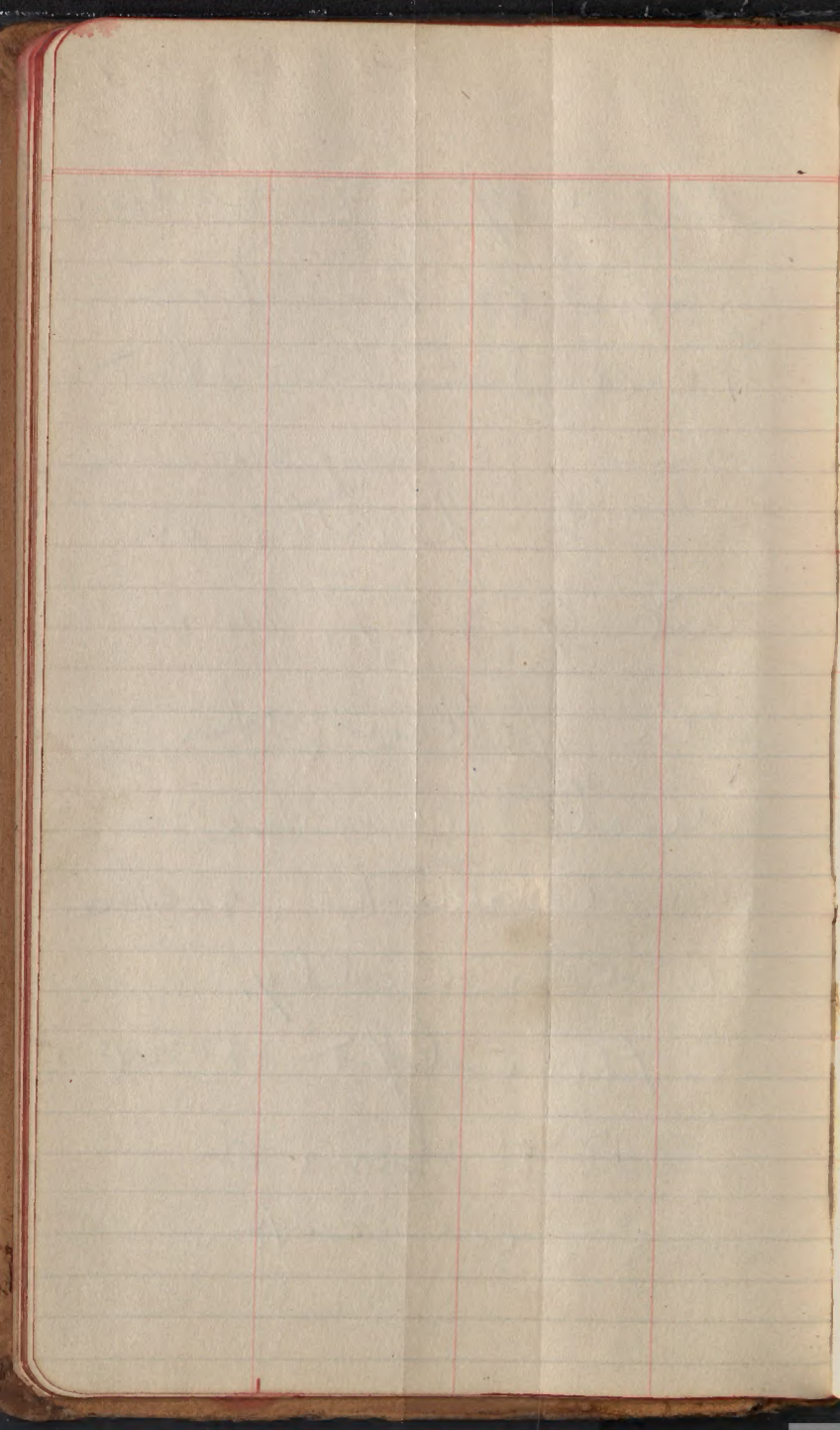
My crockers gone  
as Sammie & Abfuda are  
both with me.

At 10 A.M. broke  
camp and went  
down a valley, from



ice cap 8 miles,  
Saw a caribou,  
and Sammie shot  
him. Camped  
2 miles further on  
at 9.30 P.M.,  
we follow the  
water course  
and strike rocks  
occasionally.

Have left some  
meat & skins on  
edge ice cap.



Sept 5, 19, 1914  
9<sup>th</sup> Day.

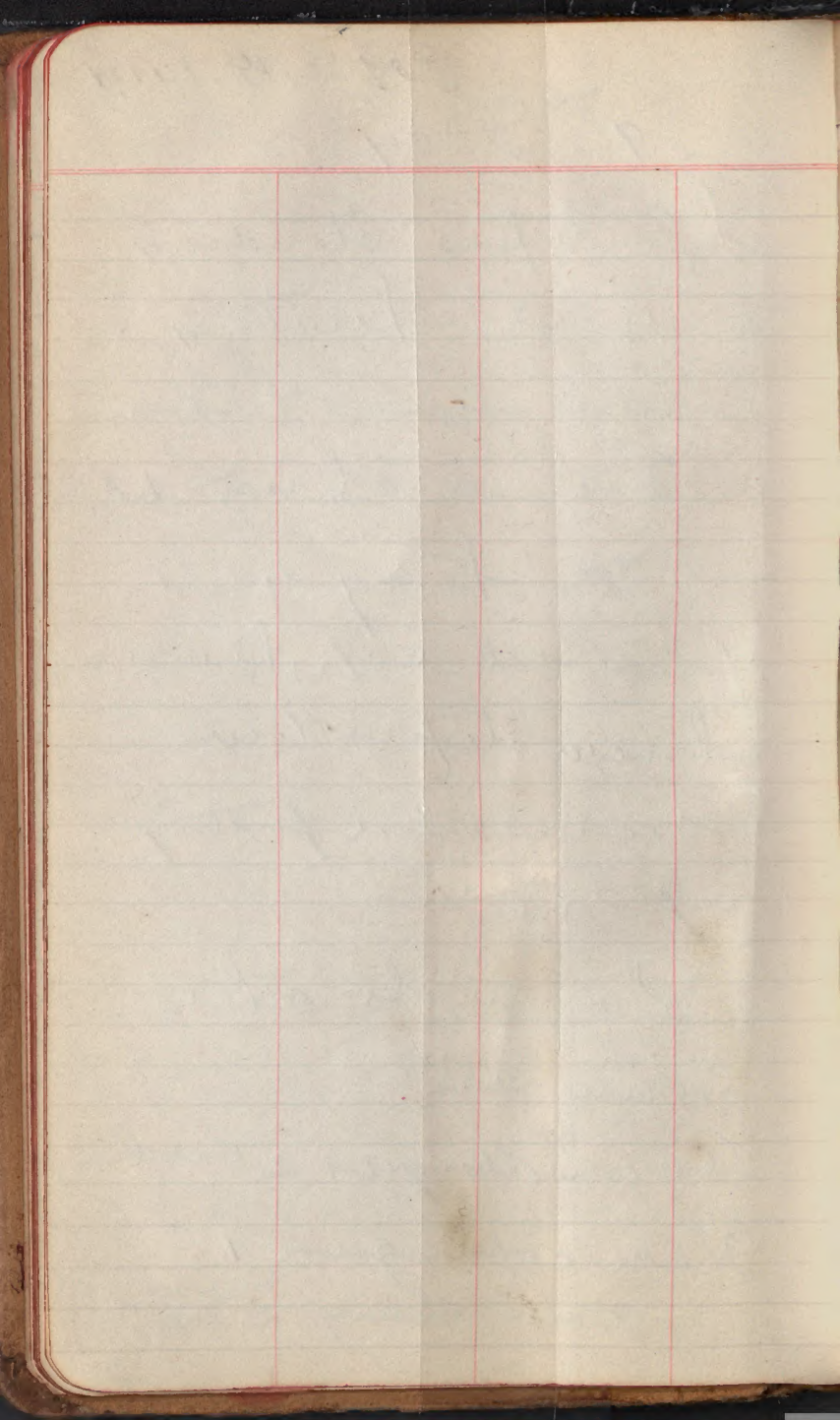
Left types standing  
& went hunting,  
Pomme, Jim & I  
returned about 6 A.M.

Later heavy wind  
from ice cap, but warm,  
blew types down.

Succeeded putting  
up one.

In night others  
come in.

Acomodangu 2 caribou,  
Newcomengwa 1,  
saw many tracks.



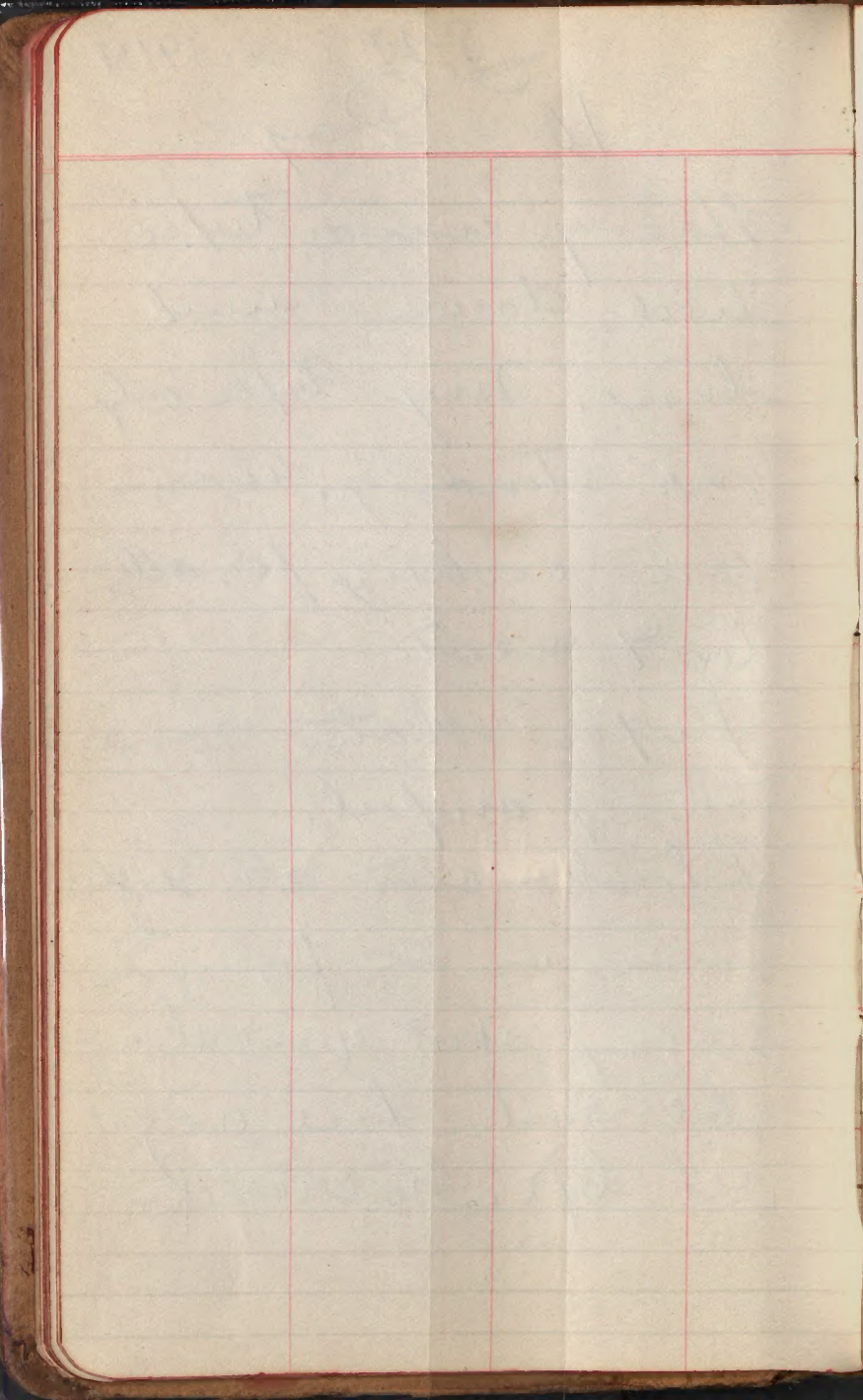
Sgt. 20, 1914  
10<sup>th</sup> Day,

Heavy wind, tupec  
tied down with  
line. My tupec only  
one standing, warm,  
am cooking for all.  
Teat meat.

Tupec slats some  
thing awful.

Petook - out all night  
come in in forenoon  
having shot 4 caribou.

but each have one gal  
oil left. No crackers.

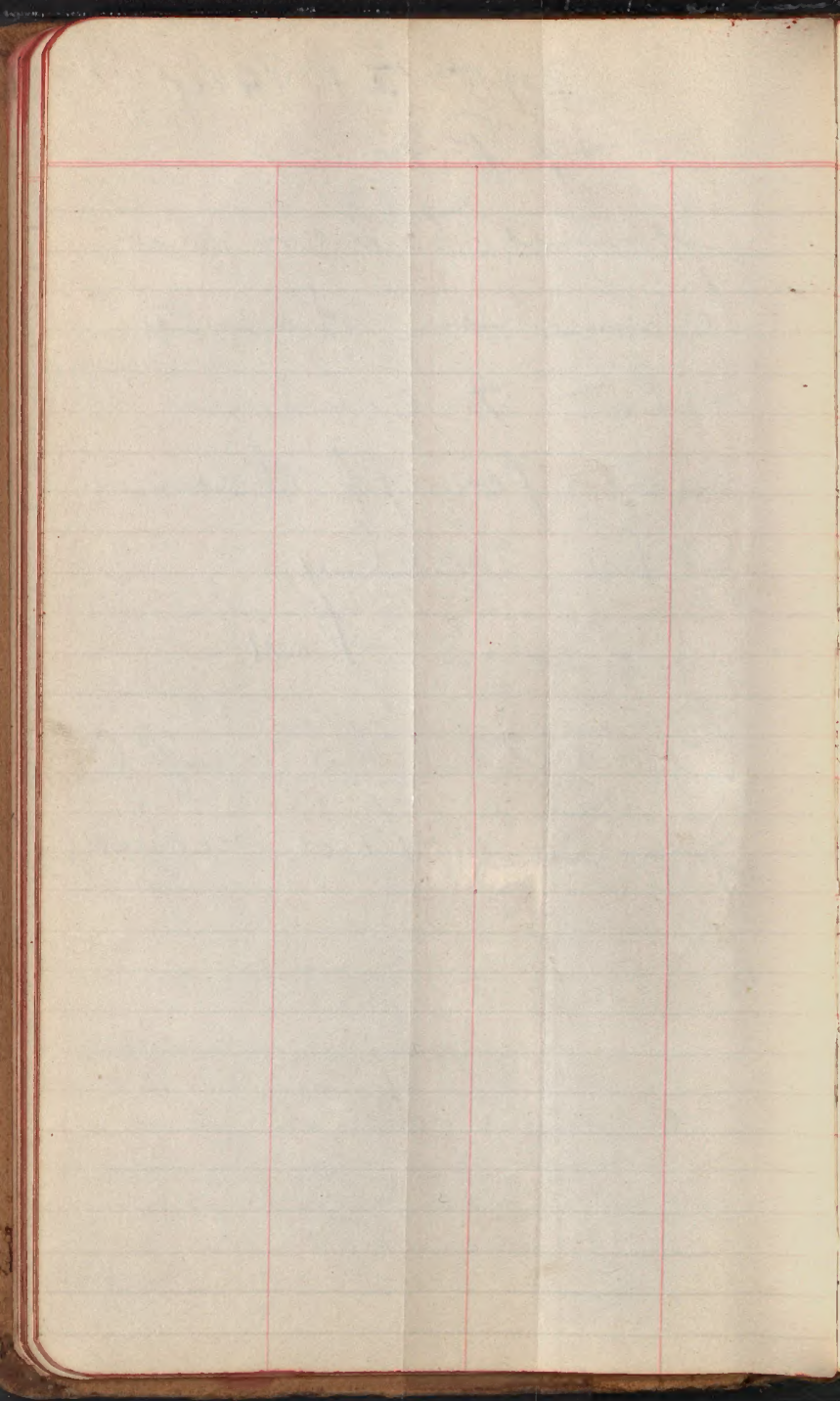


Sept 21, 1914

at 7 P.M.

Jimmie & Sammie  
came in having  
shot 7 caribou  
not far off down  
the valley.

Sammie had  
Eliakoshook's rifle  
Jimmie had mine.



Sept 22, 1914  
11<sup>th</sup> Day,

Out at 7 A.M.

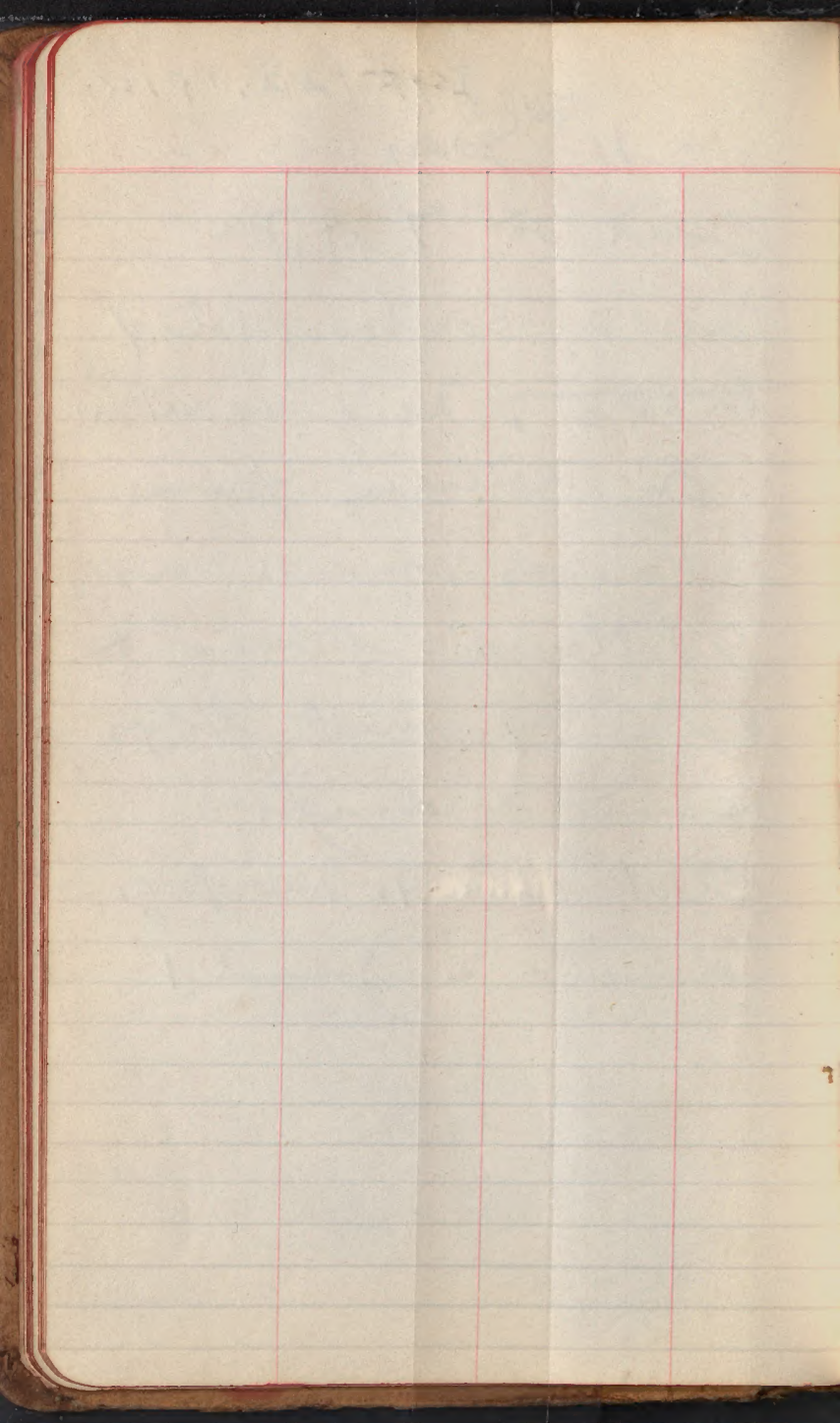
Saw 2 coribos, lots of  
tracks, nice weather  
on return found

eskimos moved camp.

I followed tracks &  
came up with sledges  
about midnight.

Took shot 4, Newcaferg, 5

Sommi - 2 June 1

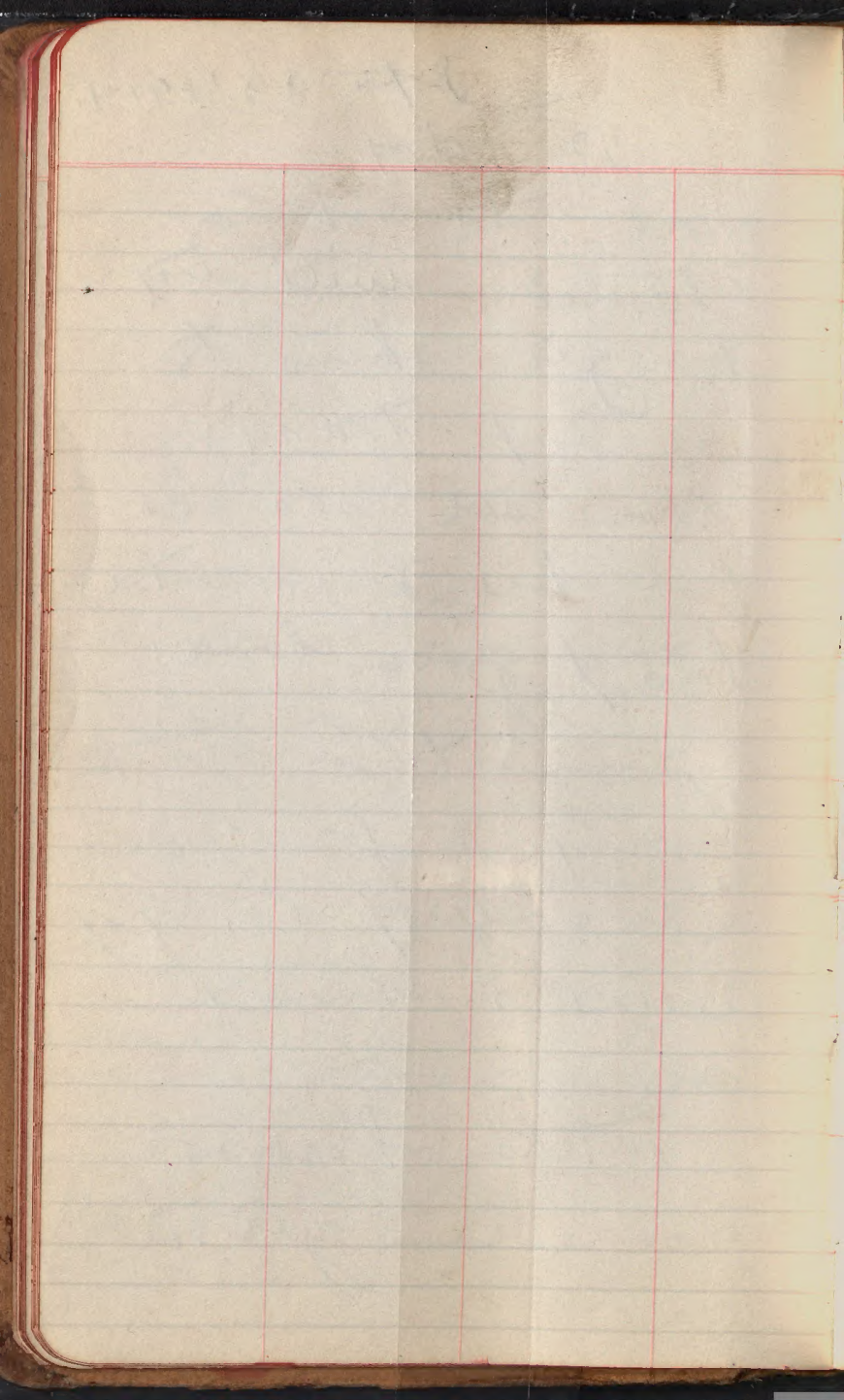


Sept 23, 1914

Hove told Eskimo  
Etamel. will try  
to get skins to  
ice cap today,  
can see sea ice  
from here. nice weather,  
lots of grass land.

Jim & I strike  
camp & proceed  
to edge of ice cap  
with 5 skins &  
some meat,

others have not  
come in yet. 8,30 P.  
3

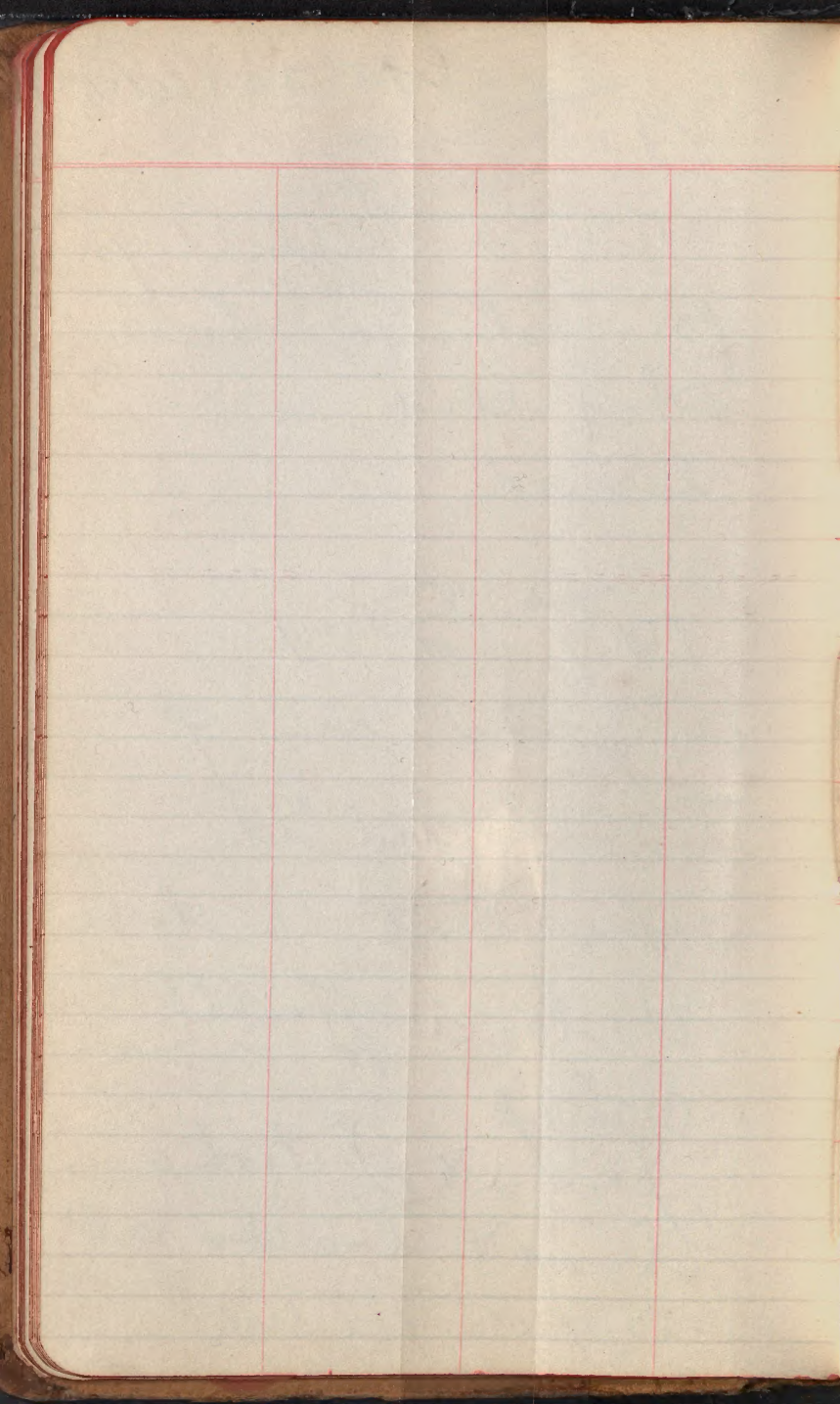


Sept 24, 1914

15<sup>th</sup> Day,

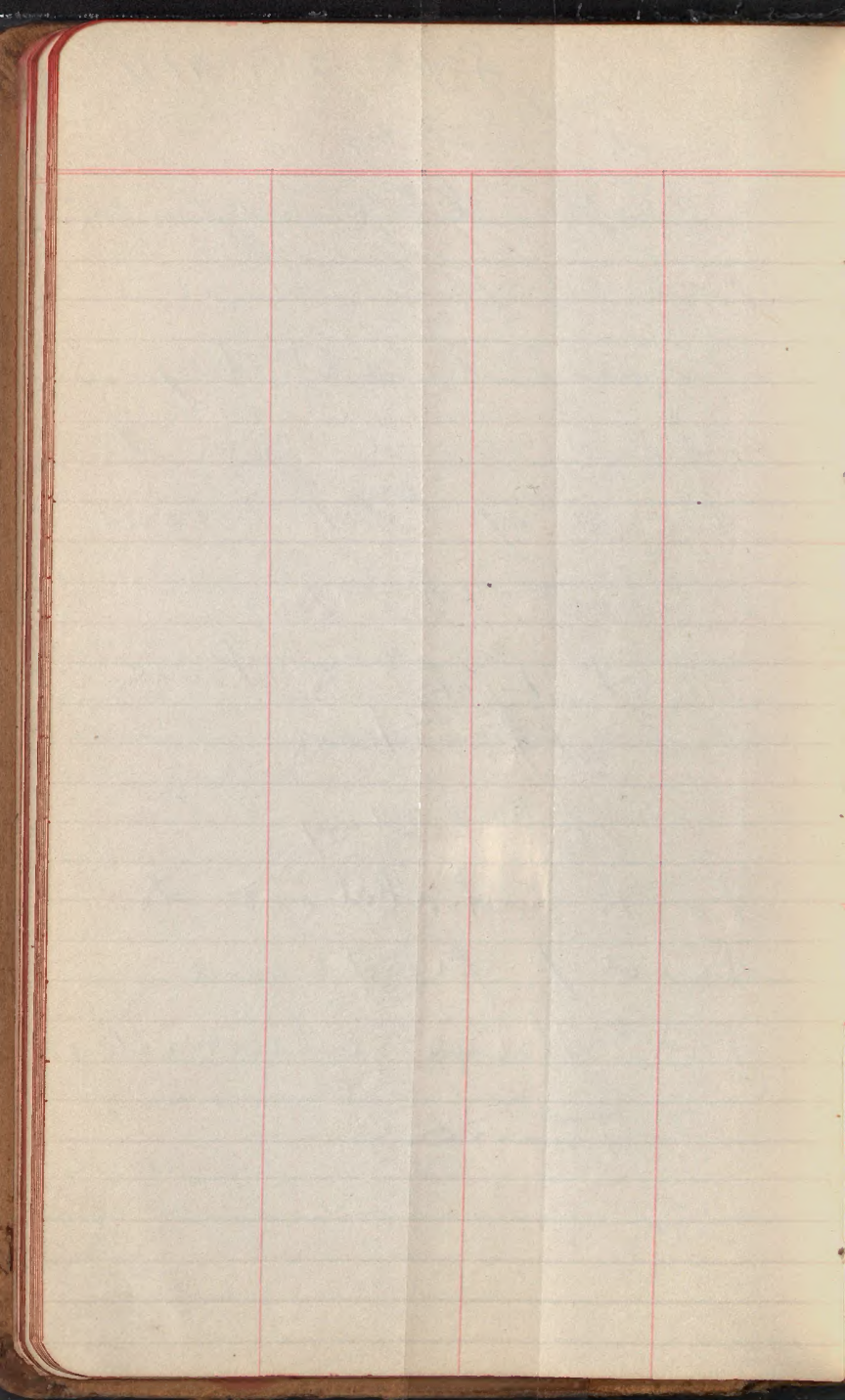
Slept lost night in  
ice cap.

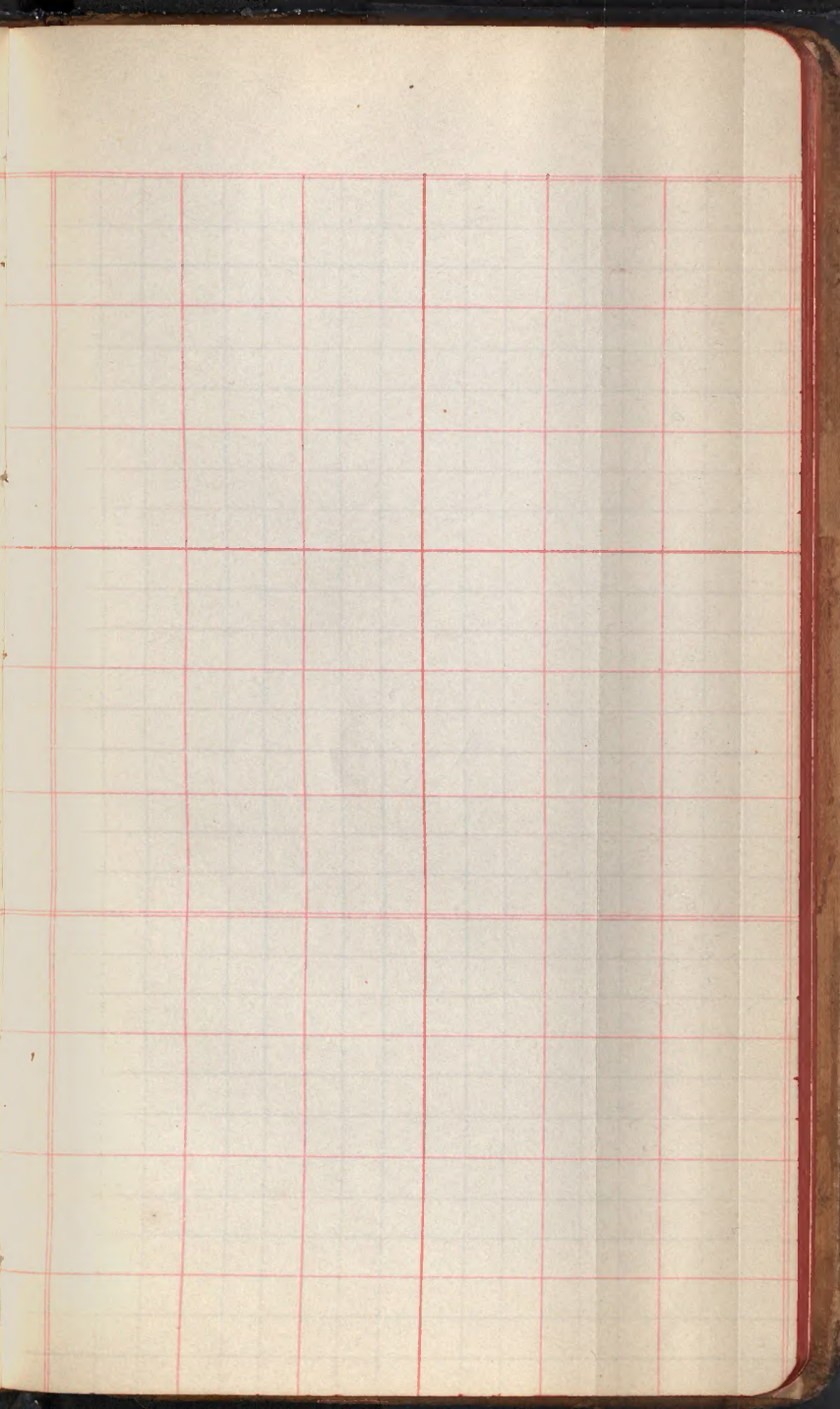
Traveled all day

about 10 P.M.

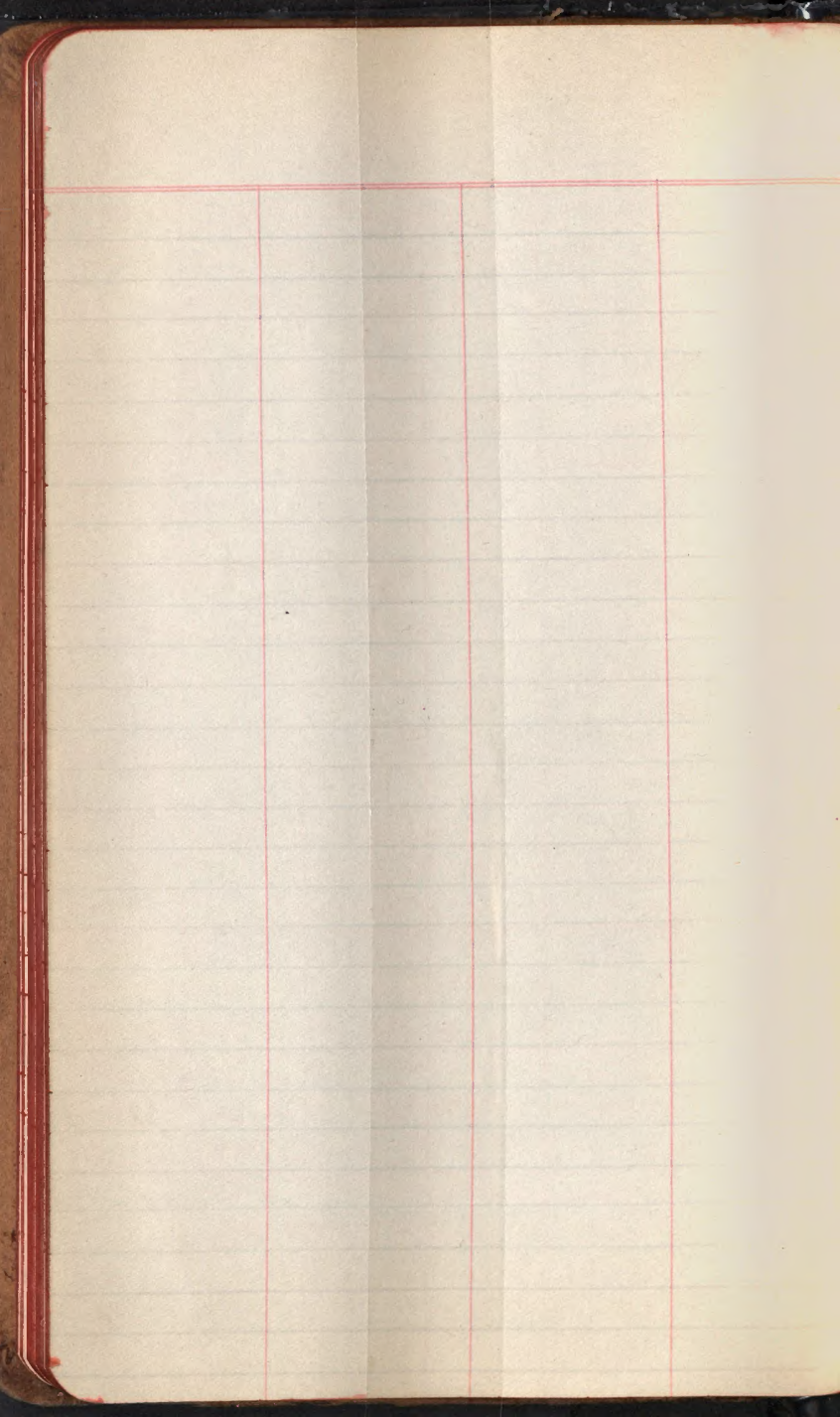
Took kayak to house  
and slept there.

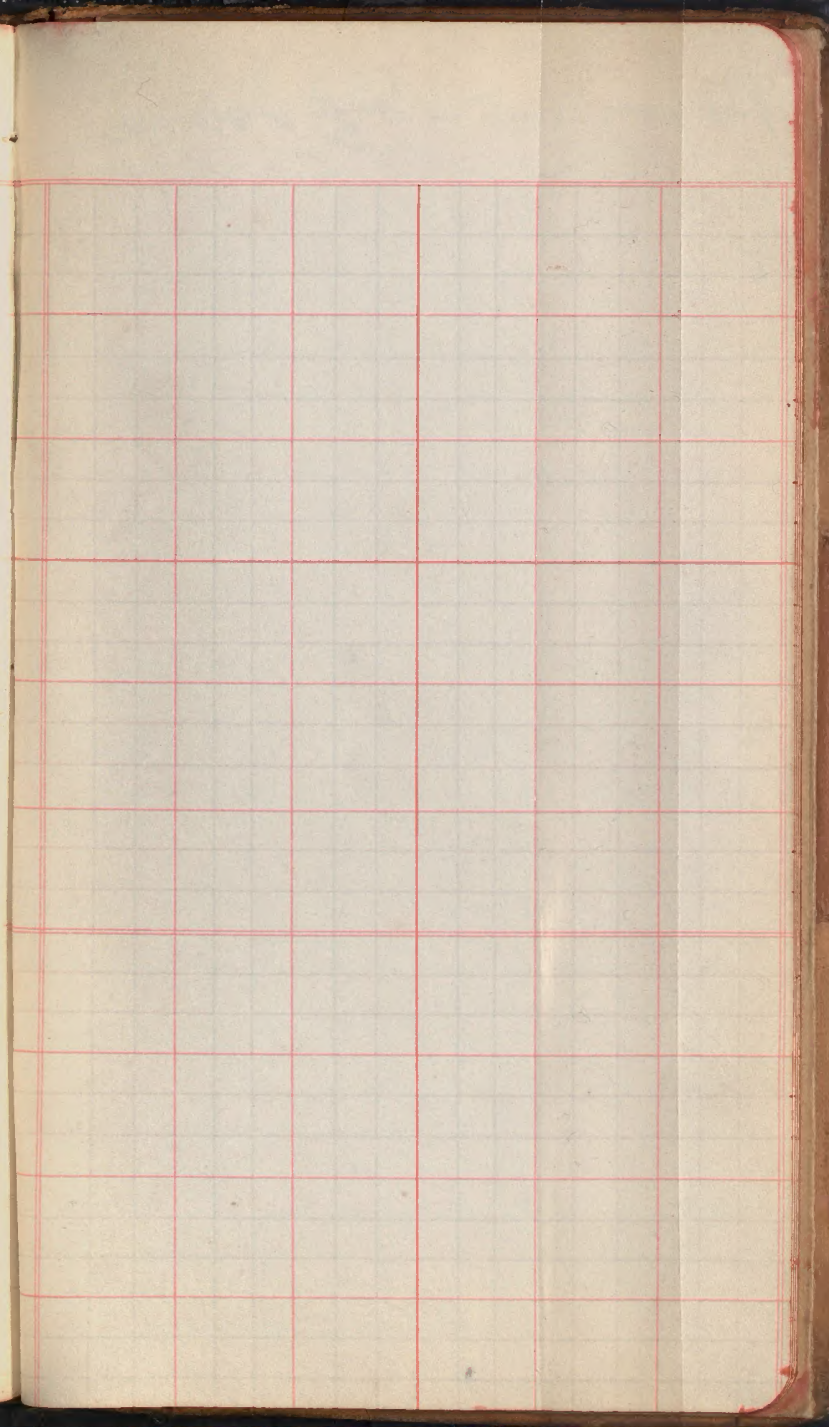
16<sup>th</sup> Day

Tuna,

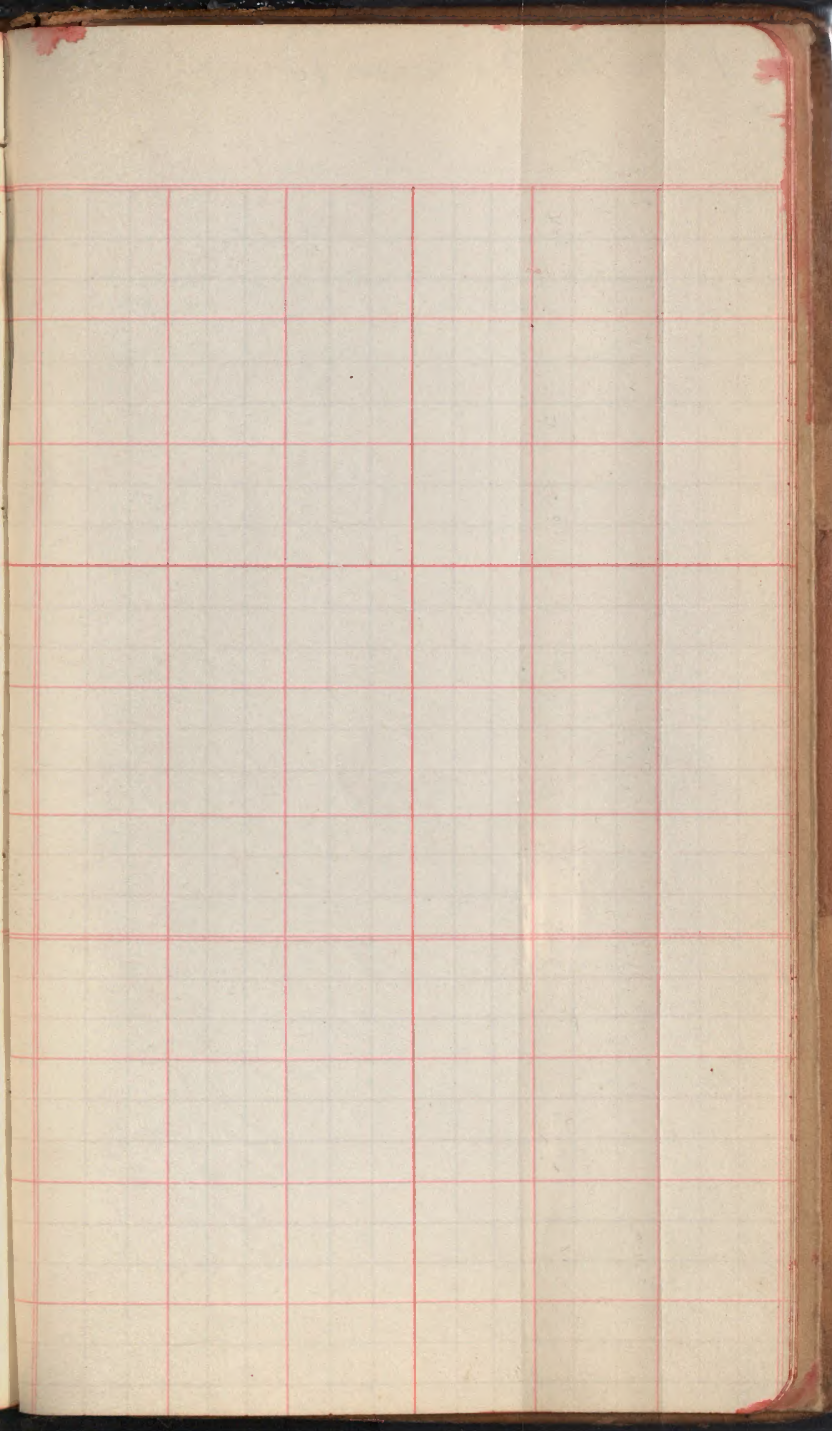








Provision Point - Dog Island



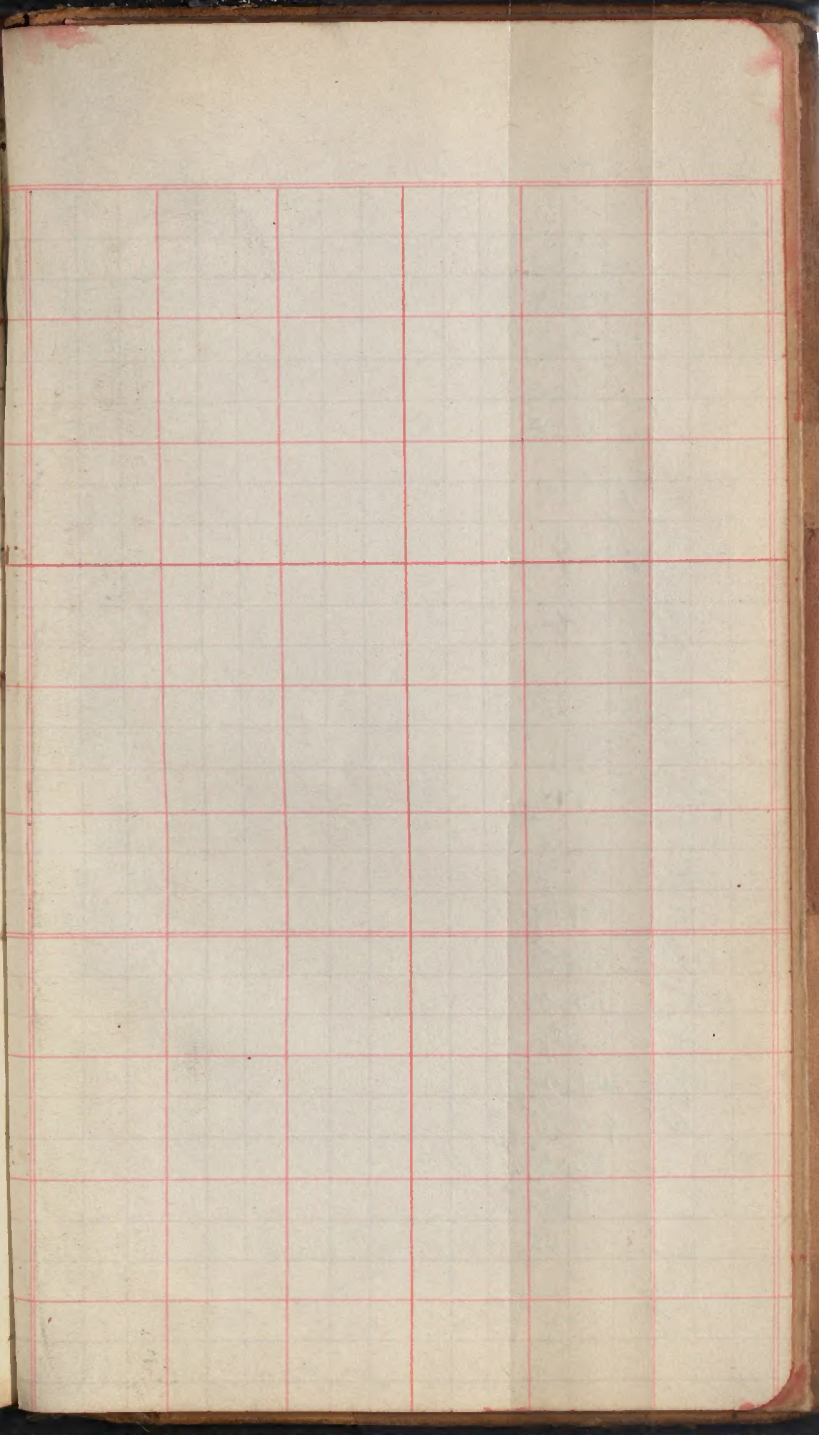
Burien to Prosser Point,

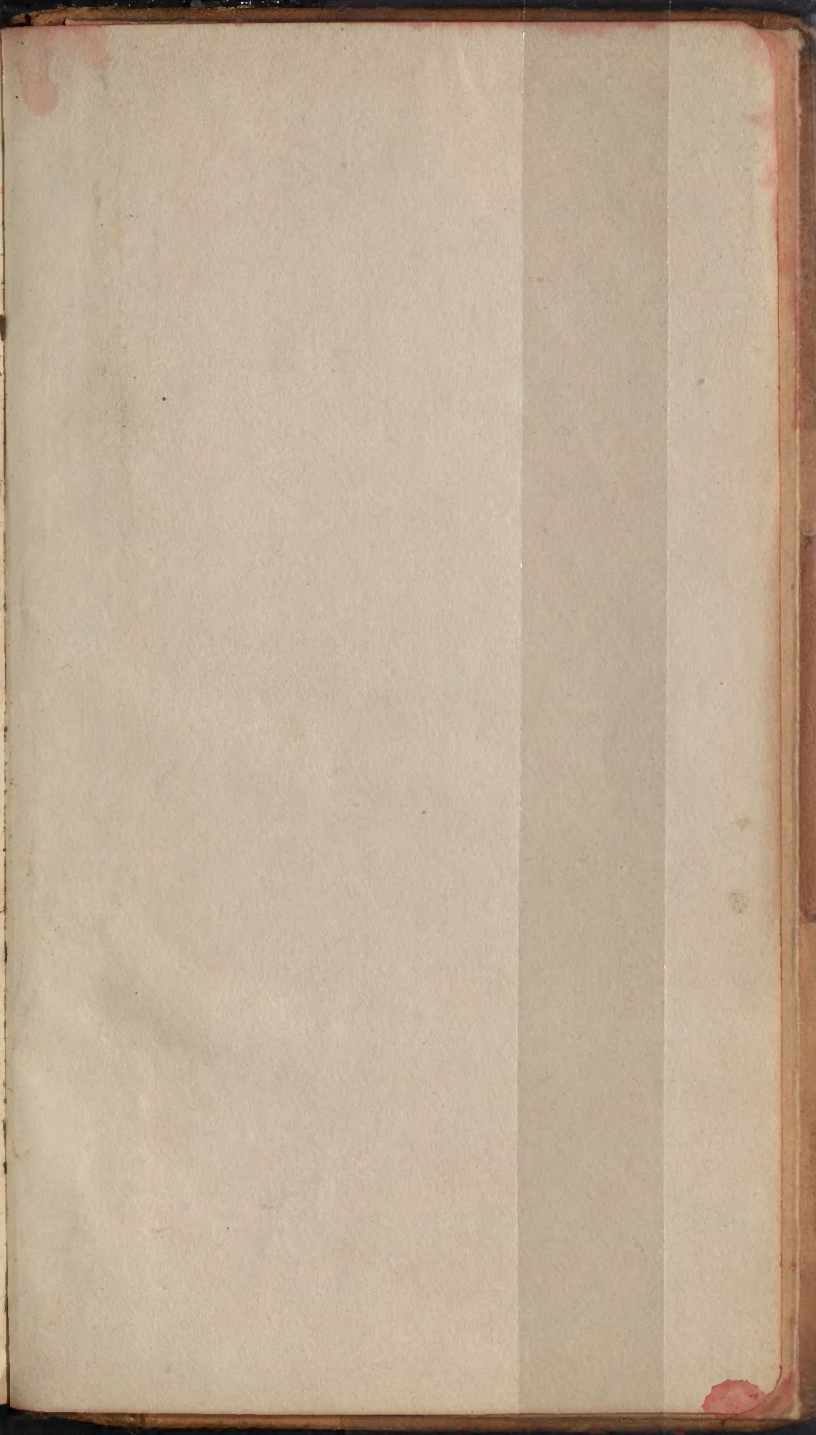
